# VIEW FROM DRESSING ROOM AND DUG-OUT . . .

## this week head coach SCOTT NAYLOR

**HELLO everyone and welcome to today's game against Hunslet RLFC at the Vestacare Stadium.**

Our opponents come to us today with the same record as us in the league - two wins and two defeats - and they are one place behind us in the table.

It's pretty obvious we have to get back to playing the quality of rugby we are capable of and not the average stuff we've played in our previous two games against North Wales Crusaders and Bradford Bulls.

We showed against York City Knights and Halifax what we are all about on the rugby field when we produced tough defence and high-skill offence.

On the back of those qualities our kicking game in those two matches was fantastic and we had lots

of good field position that enabled us to attack.

It was clear against the Bulls that we never really had a chance to attack because we never had field position due to the number of penalties we conceded and poor last-play kicks.

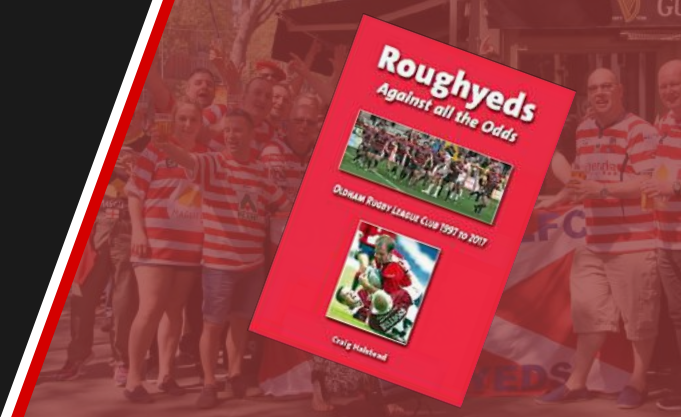




# ROUGHYEDS AGAINST ALL THE ODDS

# Roughyed Fan Focus:

## Jim Hallas

### **Q: How long have you been watching Oldham?**

I'm almost 88 and I've watched Oldham since I was about 15, so that's over 70 years now. My Dad took me the first time I went, I think we were playing Swinton. After that I was hooked and I've been going ever since.

### **Q: Do you have any favourite all-time players?**

Alan Davies, but with Derek "Rocky" Turner a close second. Then there was Bernard Ganley. When he used to line-up a kick you didn't even have to watch, you just knew he'd put the ball through the posts.

### **Q: What's your most memorable game?**

There have been so many over the years, good times and bad and many happy memories. I'll never forget the Championship Final at Odsal when we beat Hull 15-14.

I remember that late in the game Hull scored a try. The crowd hushed as Colin Hutton attempted the conversion but fortunately for us, the ball sailed wide and we were champions.

### **Q: Any funny stories whilst at the match?**

I've been hit on the head with the ball a couple of times. That always raises a laugh.



When I got married my wife used to find out the result before I got home and if we'd lost she tie a piece of black cloth around my knife and fork!

There was a time up at Whitehaven. I like a bit of Karaoke and when I got up to sing I was so impressive that I proved a big hit with the local ladies. The Oldham fans who were there don't let me forget about that I can tell you.

### **Q: How do you rate Oldham's chances this year?**

There are a lot of strong teams in League 1 this year, it's really competitive. I thought the cup win at Halifax was a great performance and I just hope we can keep up the momentum against the better teams in the division.

I like our half-back partnership of Paul Crook and Dave Hewitt. I think they work really well together and there'll be more to come from them as the season progresses.



# Joseph Platt steered new code through its early years . . .

**GEORGE COWBURN** continues his series in which he looks at Oldham's contribution to big events in RL history



WALK along Queen Street in Oldham, look up and you will see a blue plaque headed 'Joseph Platt 1863-1930' situated near to his old offices at numbers 9-11 Queen Street.

The plaque commemorates his tenure as secretary of the Northern Union (the original name of the Rugby Football League) from 1895 to 1920 and describes Platt as the father figure of Rugby League as well as being an official of the Oldham club.

Joseph Platt had been involved in the running of the Oldham club, as a committee member and later as treasurer, at the time of the breakaway from the Rugby Football Union.

Described as forthright, determined and energetic he held managerial positions in various local businesses with a particular

interest in the music hall and the theatre. His administrative and business skills would serve both Oldham and the game itself well until his death in 1930.

So how did the split from the RFU come about and what happened to the fledgling organisation afterwards?

The game of rugby, roughly akin to today's game, developed in the public schools and universities, notably at Rugby School. Refined gradually from earlier, ungoverned local games of "village football", it was codified in 1871 following the formation of the RFU, which was based, as it still is today, at Twickenham in London.

The game spread rapidly and was taken up enthusiastically in the North of England where its physicality appealed to

the men who did the hard laborious manual jobs of the day.

Different views as to how the game should be played soon became apparent. More of a social game in the South, it was taken far more seriously "up North", particularly after the start of the County Cups.

The Yorkshire Cup got underway in 1877 and was soon attracting massive crowds for that time. With local pride at stake it wasn't long before players were swapping clubs with financial inducements and offers of cushy jobs.

Having players who were fitter, better trained and



better motivated, the northern teams held sway over their southern rivals.

In 1866, alarmed at this northern dominance and possible loss of control as more northern clubs joined, the RFU outlawed all payments to players, cash or in kind, at its 1886 annual meeting. The game was to be purely amateur. Several witch-hunts followed, notably led by Rev Frank Marshall, a headmaster at Almondbury in Huddersfield.

Clubs and players were suspended or banned for alleged breaches of the amateur laws.

The inevitable split was accelerated when a motion to pay a broken-time payment of up to six shillings (30p to you young 'uns) to compensate players for loss of earnings when playing was defeated at the RFU annual meeting of 1893.

In those days most players could ill afford to lose their Saturday wages to play the game, so the defeat of

this sensible proposal and a wish to have more local control culminated in the meeting of representatives of 21 Yorkshire and Lancashire clubs at the George Hotel in Huddersfield on Thursday, August 29, 1895.

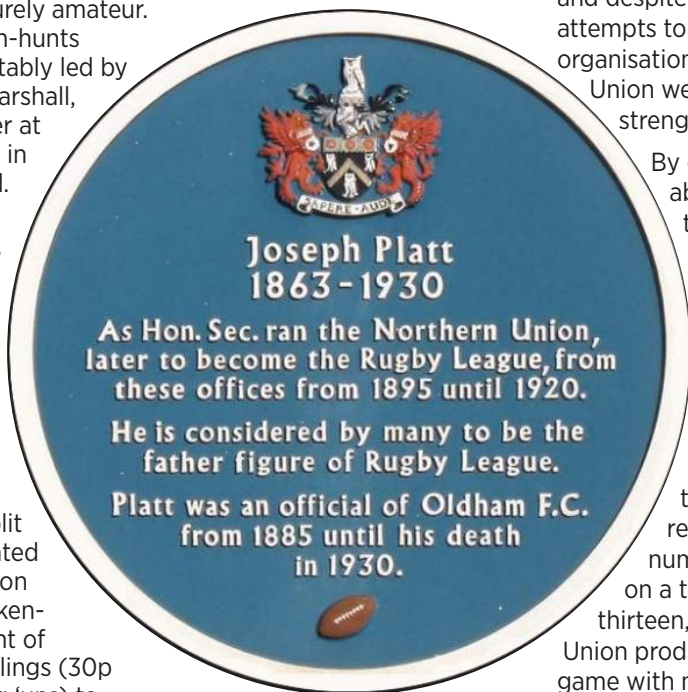
Twenty clubs - all bar Dewsbury - voted in

held until 1920. Just nine days after the breakaway the Northern Union's first games were played although Oldham didn't make their debut until September 14 when they lost 16-8 at Hunslet.

Despite a financial loss in the first season and despite the RFU's attempts to crush the new organisation, the Northern Union went from strength to strength.

By gradually abolishing the line-out, altering the scoring method to encourage more try-scoring, introducing the play-the-ball and reducing the number of players on a team to thirteen, the Northern Union produced a faster game with more spectator appeal.

When Joseph Platt left his post he had guided the organisation through its difficult early years and left it in rude health . . . a fitting achievement for Oldham's "father of Rugby League".

# Our Visitors

## Hunslet RLFC

**Oldham entertain Hunslet this afternoon in the first encounter between the two clubs since the League 1 Grand Final of 2014.**

Hunslet won the game, staged at Headingley Stadium, 17-16 after a Thomas Coyle golden-point drop goal in extra time. The Yorkshire side would go on to spend 2015 in the Championship but were relegated after just one season.

Oldham's promotion in 2015 and two Championship campaigns meant the two clubs avoided each other in all competitions.

Mid-table finishes for Hunslet in seasons 2016 and 2017 demonstrate that a relegated club cannot expect an easy ride back in lower company, especially when the make-up of League 1 is progressively more competitive.

Coach Gary Thornton took over the reins halfway through last season's

campaign and improved the team's performances in the second half of the year. Ten wins out of fourteen led to the club lifting the League 1 Shield, defeating London Skolars 32-12 in the final.

Recruitment for 2018 has seen players from second-tier clubs join Thornton's side. Cain Southernwood, Nathan Chappell and Duane Straugheir will provide experience and will allow the club to set its sights on a top 5 finish and another shot at promotion.

Two wins in the opening two games of Hunslet's 2018 campaign saw maximum points take from Hemel Stags away (28-14) and North Wales Crusaders at home (26-10). Two losses followed, with defeats at both Bradford (32-12) and at home to Keighley (38-22).

The defeat against Keighley was described by Coach Thornton as "the worst display since I became coach."



A second game against Bradford on Easter Monday, this time at home and in the Challenge Cup, saw a much better performance despite a 34-10 defeat. Thornton may now have a selection headache for today's game.

Former Roughyeds players Danny Grimshaw, Tom Ashton and Nathan Chappell are now members of the Hunslet squad and could line-up against their former team mates although Grimshaw has yet to make his seasonal debut.

A third league win of the year is the prize on offer this afternoon and an opportunity for both clubs to stay in touch with the leading positions. By the time the two sides face each other again in June, both would hope to be settled in one of the higher slots and the obvious advantages at the business end of the year.



# Three to watch

## Hunslet RLFC



### Jimmy Watson

A full-back and big favourite with the Hunslet fans. Initially played at the South Leeds Stadium on dual registration from Leeds Rhinos but signed a permanent deal in 2013.

Scored a crucial try against Oldham in the 2014 Grand Final as Hunslet went on to gain promotion.



### Joe Sanderson

Half-back and product of Drighlington ARLFC, Joe signed for Leeds Rhinos in 2013 and firmly established himself in the club's Academy team.

Signed for Hunslet in 2017 and made 19 appearances that year, scoring 13 tries and kicking 102 goals with an 88 per cent successful conversion rate.



### Lewis Reed

Prop-forward who moved to Hunslet from Keighley Cougars in 2014. A big hard tackling player, Reed had 4 years experience with Bradford Bulls but made the move to South Leeds for the opportunity of regular first-team football.



# Hull KR next after big win at Halifax

**SINCE we last played on home territory we've progressed to the fifth round of the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup with an inspirational 27-6 win at Halifax --- our first win at The Shay since April, 2004.**

On a memorable night for the Roughyeds (the tie was rearranged for midweek after snow caused a Sunday postponement) we scored tries by Danny Langtree, Ben West, Matt Reid and Paul Crook, who also landed three conversions and two penalties for a personal points haul of 14 points. David Hewitt dropped a goal.

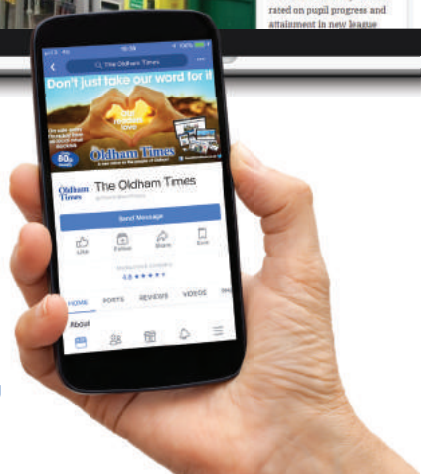
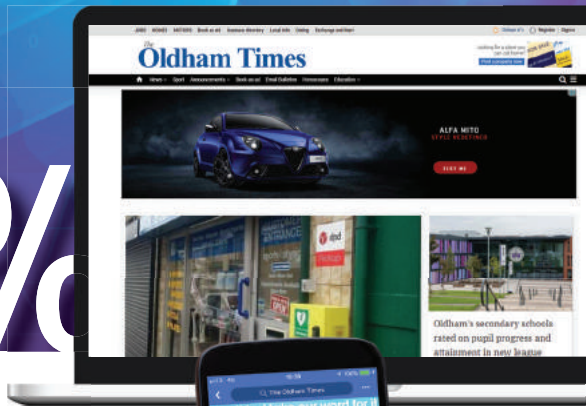
