A brilliant play-off series that ended in heartbreak with Super League the star prize

GEORGE COWBURN continues his series in which he looks at Oldham's contribution to big events in RL history

THE 2000-01 season was Mike Ford's second in charge at Oldham as player-coach and his last as a player.

He signed off in the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final, a match which, had Oldham won, would have seen them promoted to Super League.

The NFP was Rugby League's second-tier competition behind Super League and midway through the season there was little sign of Oldham reaching the play-offs let alone the final.

A superb run of nine consecutive victories, including seven in 22 days, propelled Oldham into fourth place, level on points with third-placed Rochdale Hornets, a point behind second-placed Widnes but ten behind league winners Leigh.

For their preliminary semi-final Oldham would travel to Hilton

Park to play Leigh in a game few gave them a chance of winning.

In a major surprise, however, Oldham became the first side to win at Leigh in 16 months by the narrowest margin, 15-14, with local lad Keith Brennan's drop goal separating the two teams.

Two tries by John Hough (another Oldhamer) and Mark Sibson, plus three Pat Rich goals, made up the rest of the points.

The play-offs were recorded by Yorkshire TV for their programme 'Rugby League Raw' and when interviewed afterwards Ford reminded Oldham fans: "We have won nothing yet."

Such a great performance though was cause enough for Roughyeds supporters to celebrate.

That win set up a mouth-watering major semi-final at Spotland against our neighbours Rochdale Hornets with a place in the Grand Final at stake.

After 68 minutes few Oldham fans thought we would make the final.

We trailed 32-14 with 12 minutes left. In a last throw of the dice Ford returned to the field nursing a head knock from earlier in the the game.

What followed was the most amazing passage of play seen in a long time from an Oldham team. We scored 25 unanswered points in a tidal wave of attacks that swept aside the Hornets defence.

Oldham scored five tries in total - two by Kiwi forward Brian Henare and one each by Keith Brennan, Leo Casey and Joe McNicholas.

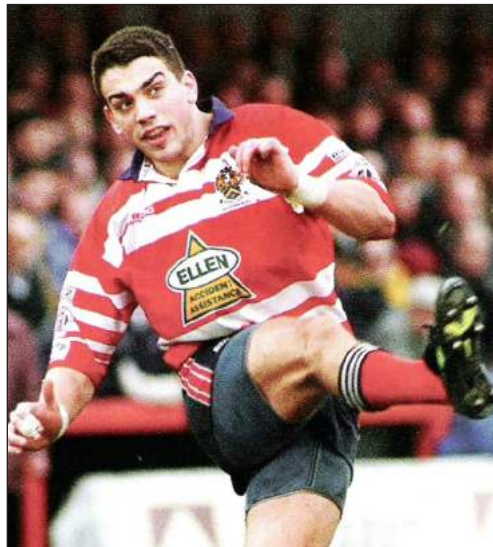
Ford chipped in with an important drop goal late on but the real match winner was Pat Rich, whose goal-kicking was immaculate.

Nine goals from nine attempts - the last two from the touchline under great pressure - made the vital difference

that sent Oldham into the Grand Final.

All roads then led to Spotland as a crowd of 8,974 filled the ground to capacity on a sunny Saturday, July 28 for the Grand Final against a Widnes side captained by former Oldham favourite Martin Crompton.

Watched by a live TV audience, the game wasn't a classic - too many mistakes for that - but Widnes were deserved winners by 24-14 with a little too much know-how and experience from players such as Paul Atcheson, Jason Demetriou, Crompton, Richard Agar, Phil Cantillon and Tommy Hodgkinson.

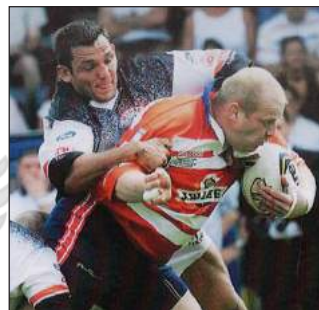
The loss of skipper Leo Casey after 20 minutes didn't help and try decisions by the video referee went against Oldham as Widnes seemed to get the

benefit of the doubt on two occasions.

The mammoth efforts of top tackler Phil Farrell, grafter Paul "Knocker" Norton and the Gibbons twins, Anthony and David, came to nought and the 151st and final try in Ford's career was of scant consolation.

Oldham scored first when Brennan took advantage of hesitation in the Widnes defence following a Dave Gibbons high kick and the last two tries came at the end --- for Ford off a Kevin Mannion pass and for Mannion himself after a Dave Gibbons break and link with Ford.

A seemingly nervous Rich (not the only one) could only manage one goal in contrast to his heroics in the semi- final.

WE have three milestone men this week, headed by club captain GARETH OWEN (above) who will reach 100 games for us against Whitehaven today.

He made his debut, on loan from Salford, in coach Scott Naylor's second year here, 2014, and later joined us as a contracted Oldham player, eventually to be honoured with the captaincy of his home-town club.

"I couldn't think of anything to make me prouder," he said.

His best seasons were in the Championship in 2016 and 2017, although injury restricted him in the latter to 18 appearances.

Milestone man No 2, PAUL CROOK, reached 2,000 career points in our win at Hemel where he kicked ten goals and scored two tries.

In his first season here, he has kicked 104 goals and scored four tries for 224 points.

DANNY LANGTREE, milestone man No 3, scored twice at Hemel to total 17 for the year --- the best by a second-row man in the 21-year history of the new club.

Five into three wont go, so play-off battle will be a thriller

WHATEVER criticism is levelled at the structuring of rugby league competitions, the fact remains that a strength of Betfred League 1 is that everybody plays everyone else home and away with a play-off at the end.

"It's a simple, basic model that the wider sporting public understands," says Newcastle Thunder official Mick Hogan.

With six games left to the end of the regular season it's shaping up into two well-defined battles.

There's the one between Bradford Bulls and York City Knights to finish top and go up automatically and another in which five clubs, including Oldham, will be involved in a bare-knuckle scrap for the remaining three play-off spots.

It could hardly be tighter. The five are separated by two points and four of them, Oldham, Doncaster, Hunslet and Whitehaven, are all on 26 points.

Workington are in pole position with 28 points, but Roughyeds have a for-and-against difference which is vastly superior to the rest and will be worth another league point if it



comes down to points scored and conceded.

It's going to be a roller-coaster few weeks so make a note of when we're playing here at The Vestacare Stadium and please do your best to attend - and bring a friend -- because we can't stress too much that home support can be our 18th man.

After today we play Coventry Bears here on Sunday, September 2 and Bradford Bulls, the big one, on Sunday, September 16.

Of the five, only Oldham and Workington Town have still to play both Bradford and York, while Doncaster have already played them both, home and away.

The five will go into battle like this:

WORKINGTON TOWN (28 points): Home: Coventry Bears (today), York City Knights, London Skolars; Away: Bradford Bulls, Newcastle Thunder, Doncaster.

OLDHAM (26): Home: Whitehaven (today), Coventry Bears, Bradford Bulls; Away: Newcastle Thunder, York City Knights, London Skolars.

DONCASTER (26): Home: London Skolars (today), Newcastle Thunder, Workington Town; Away: Whitehaven, Keighley, North Wales Crusaders.

HUNSLET (26): Home: Hemel Stags (today), London Skolars, Newcastle Thunder; Away: York City Knights, Whitehaven, Coventry Bears.

WHITEHAVEN (26): Home: Doncaster, Hunslet, Coventry Bears; Away: Oldham (today), Hemel Stags, York City Knights.

Whitehaven

Oldham host Whitehaven today for the first time since a thrilling do-or-die fixture on the penultimate weekend of the 2016 season.

The game, played at Bower Fold, was a relegation duel won 20-18 by Oldham. The result relegated the Cumbrians but ensured Oldham's Championship survival.

Scenes of joy and despair were displayed on the pitch and terraces as both sides and supporters reflected on the thrilling drama that had just unfolded.

Whitehaven almost bounced straight back into the Championship during the 2017 League 1 season. A play-off semi-final at The Recreation Ground against York saw the two sides locked at 20-20 after 80 minutes. Extra time couldn't produce a winner and it was left to a Ste Roper golden-point drop-goal in the 105th minute to set up a play-off final game with Barrow Raiders.

Whitehaven, featuring stand-off Paul Crook, were unable to reproduce their heroics at Craven Park a week later and despite a valiant effort, they went

down 10-6 and were consigned to a second season in the third tier of the game.

Haven's 2018 season began with a round 1 fixture at home to Oldham. A new look Roughyeds side made the long trip north to face Carl Forster's 'Haven, a tough test for any side.

Oldham were able to win the game 14-0 and record a rare victory at the Recreation Ground.

A thumping 44-6 away defeat at Doncaster in their next game meant that Haven had to wait until the middle of March to record their first win of the season – against Hemel Stags. That victory spurred on Forster's side in their next game and they were able to record a 14-12 win against their old foe Workington Town.

April and May's fixtures brought four wins out of five for Haven with only a blip at home to North Wales Crusaders blotting the copybook. Most notable of all was a 26-18 win over high-flying York City Knights who have only been beaten by one other side this season: Bradford Bulls.



A tremendous effort. June saw a reversal of fortunes as losses came against Newcastle, Bradford and Hunslet whereas July saw a string of five consecutive victories. None of the games were more important than completing a double against Workington, this time winning 24-22.

Last time out Whitehaven visited the cauldron of Odsal Stadium where they faced a Bradford Bulls side eyeing an automatic promotion place at the top of the table. Bulls coach John Kear has challenged his players to win all their remaining games and they easily despatched the visitors 46-0.

Haven will want to return to winning ways today and keep up with the pack chasing those three play-off places. Oldham will want to keep their noses in front and record a double over the men from the Recreation Ground.

It should be a great game.

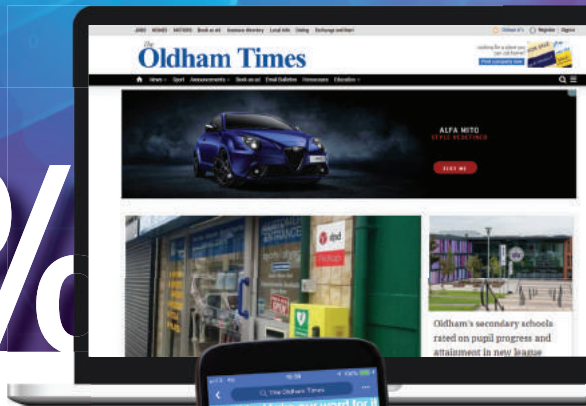
