# **Business as usual until we hear anything different**

YOU must have heard all the speculation and conjecture in League circles about those leaked proposals to extend the Championship to 14 clubs next season and to achieve it by relegating only one club and by promoting THREE.

It's the latest twist to the long-running saga about structure changes and a new look at the distribution of central funding with feelings running high between Super League clubs on the one hand and Championship and League 1 clubs on the other.

Clubs have now called an extraordinary general meeting in which to thrash out the pros and cons.

Super League clubs want to scrap the Super 8s Qualifiers after this season and replace it with one up and one down.

As part of the proposed package, the Championship would be extended by two clubs and that would be achieved by tinkering almost immediately with the promotion and relegation structure between the Championship and League 1, which has been in place all season.

Only one club would come down, instead of two, and three would go up from Betfred League 1 instead of two.

It has been understood all season that only the top team in Betfred League 1 would win automatic promotion with the second promotion spot going to the winner of a play-off featuring teams finishing two to five inclusive.

If these latest leaked proposals were to go through both York City Knights and Bradford Bulls would go up automatically and there would be a third promotion place for the winner of a play-off for teams finishing three to six inclusive.

When this issue of 'Roughyed Review' went to press in midweek, this whole debate was in the melting pot and, like all clubs, Roughyeds and Scott Naylor had to take the view that it was business as usual until they heard anything differently.

As far as the Roughyeds squad was concerned going into today's game

against Coventry Bears, it is still one up automatically followed by a play-off featuring either Bradford or York and the next three in the table at the end of the regular season.

Oldham will regard each of their four games as "must win" whatever happens or doesn't happen with regard to changes in promotion and relegation.

The RFL has issued a statement, explaining that final decisions have yet to be made.

The statement went on: "It is the national governing body's role and responsibility to work collaboratively for the best outcomes for the whole sport.

"Work by the RFL includes liaison with representatives of Championship and League 1 clubs around the competition structure at these levels in the wider context of a range of other changes, all of which are focused on progressing the whole of the sport.

"It is important to note and respect that liaison with Championship and League 1 clubs on structure proposals remains live and is not yet concluded."





# **Rev Tony leaves us with best wishes - and heartfelt thanks**

REV Tony Ford, our club chaplain for the past eight years, leaves us after today's game against Coventry Bears to take on a new challenge at a church in Barrow.

The sincere best wishes of our chairman Chris Hamilton, Anne Kearns, coach Scott Naylor, the players, backroom staff, fans and everyone else at Roughyeds go with Tony and his wife Denise as they head to St Mark's in Barrow, a town-centre church that's described as the most deprived parish in Cumbria.

The club owes a great debt of gratitude to Tony for everything he has done for us since he arrived on the Roughyeds scene shortly before our first match at Whitebank, as it was then called, in 2010.

"We had a little service in the stand to mark the club's arrival at Whitebank and it coincided with the start of my chaplaincy," recalled Tony.

"It's been great to be involved with the club for so long. I've had a lot of support from Chris and others at the club and it will be a big wrench to say farewell.

"The opportunity to take on a new challenge within the



Church of England coincided with our son Calum's move to university in London and our daughter Nicola's departure from the family home to her own place in Chadderton.

"At the same time Denise and I had to decide whether we wished to stay where we were (St Mary's, Balderstone, Rochdale) until retirement or make one more move to try to turn around a big church in town-centre Barrow.

"We had seven years at Balderstone after leaving Christ Church, Chadderton and it was very emotional when we said goodbye last Sunday.

"I've been a Roughyeds fan all my life and it will be tough to leave everyone here too, but I'm sure we'll be back on visits and we'll always be with you all in spirit.

"The Roughyeds result will be the one we look out for first every Sunday."

Barrow Raiders, who don't currently have a chaplain, have made overtures to Tony, but he will settle in first at St Mark's before making a decision.

He said: "It's a much bigger parish than I've been used to so I'm going to have a lot on initially.

"In some ways I'd like to join the Raiders but it won't be like being associated with Roughyeds. That's where the heart is and will always be."

### **Q.** How long have you been watching the Roughyeds?

A. I can't remember my first game but I think it would have been in the 1979/80 season.

# **Q.** What are your most memorable games?

A. The Featherstone and Hull KR premierships standout. More recently Barrow away when

Adam Hughes got three tries and then York away when Langers and Nield scored. Both games got us to a Grand Final.

### **Q.** Do you have any favourite players, past or present?

A. My all time favourite is John Cogger - a great competitor. I always got a buzz when Adam Hughes got the ball and then Langers, a real quality player for us.

# **Q** Where in the ground do you prefer to watch the games?

A. At home matches I stand in front of cabins behind the sticks. At



away games I like to be at the end we're attacking.

# **Q.** What's your favourite away ground?

A Odsal. High admission prices and you're too far away from the action but the place is full of history and one of only a few grounds remaining where we've played as a top flight club.

# **Q.** Can you recall any funny incidents at a game?

A When the stretcher-bearers weren't able to carry Charlie McAlister at Hull KR or the match against Leigh being abandoned for fighting. I think Tom Nadiola started it when we had no chance of winning the game but we went-on to win the replay.

# **Q.** Can we make the play-offs and go on to win promotion?

A. Yes and yes. Once in the play-offs we just have to win two matches. It can be done.



# Five league finals in a row was a record that stood for more than 80 years

GEORGE COWBURN continues his series in which he looks at Oldham's contribution to big events in RL history

IN the Edwardian era cotton was still king and Oldham was a prosperous town which was reflected in the fortunes of the rugby league club and its ability to attract quality players from both home and abroad.

A measure of Oldham's standing can be gauged by the club's appearance in each of the first five of the Northern Union's newly-introduced Championship Play-Off finals, contested by the teams finishing in the top four positions in the league.

In 1907, after beating Runcorn 11-3, Oldham qualified for the inaugural Championship Final, to be held at Huddersfield's Fartown ground.

Their opponents were Halifax, who finished top of the league despite being beaten twice by Oldham in league matches and also in the Challenge Cup. Halifax gained revenge for those three reverses by easily beating Oldham 18-3. Injuries to Tommy Cash and "Birdie" Dixon meant forward Bert Avery was drafted into the centres.

An off day with the boot by the normally reliable Joe Ferguson didn't help either, although he did score Oldham's try.

Despite the bad weather a decent crowd of 13,325 watched the match and the Oldham Evening Chronicle was quoted as saying "interest in the match has been enormous".

Back again in the final in 1908, having seen off Wigan 12-5 in the semis, Oldham were up against the mighty Hunslet side, led by the game's first "superstar" Albert Goldthorpe.

It took a replay before Hunslet triumphed to become legendary winners of all four cups available to them.

After a 7-7 draw at the Willows, home of Salford, (try by Jim "Bumper" Wright and two goals by Tom White), Oldham were beaten 12-2 in the replay at Wakefield Trinity's Belle Vue ground.

The Goldthorpe brothers Albert and Walter, scored all Hunslet's points with a Tom White goal providing Oldham's only response.

They hoped for third-time lucky in 1909, but it wasn't to be, Oldham losing 7-3 to their great Lancashire rivals Wigan. Jardine scored our try.

Finishing third in the league, Oldham needed a replay to beat Halifax 8-2 after a 3-3 draw in the first match to qualify for the final to be played at the Willows ground. It was a dull, bad tempered match played in heavy rain and a gale force wind.

All the points were scored in the first half hour as conditions deteriorated and Wigan's Cheetham and Oldham's Arthur Smith were sent off for fighting.

A year later, a 12-6 semi-final win over Wakefield Trinity meant league leaders Oldham

again faced Wigan in the 1910 final, this time at Broughton's Wheaters Field ground.

Favourites Oldham, who had beaten Wigan twice in the league, finally got their hands on the trophy with a 13-7 victory.

A Billy Dixon try and goals by Alf Wood and Joe Ferguson had Oldham tied at 7-7 until the 67th minute.

They finished the stronger, however, and a Tom McCabe try from close to the line and a late George W Smith try sealed the victory.

In 1911 Oldham again beat Wakefield Trinity in the semi final (15-12) to allow the Roughyeds to contest their fifth consecutive final, and their third on the run against Wigan.

Back again at Wheaters Field (a happy hunting ground for Oldham, who won the 1899 Challenge Cup final 19-9 against Hunslet there), the Roughyeds were comfortable 20-7 winners.

By common consent, Oldham's James "Jumbo" Lomas was the man of the match with two tries and three goals in a superb all-round performance The other scorers were Tom White with two tries and Joe Ferguson with a goal.

There ended Oldham's run of five consecutive final appearances - a record held until surpassed by the great Wigan sides of the 1990s

Four Oldham players appeared in all six matches (including the final replay) - Bert Avery, Joe Ferguson and Arthur Smith, who were all internationals, plus Billy Dixon, who turned out for Cumbria the county of his birth.

Other famous players to grace

the finals for Oldham included Welshmen Dickie Thomas and Tom Llewellyn, New Zealand international George W Smith, Australian internationals A.E.(George) Anlezark, Sid Deane and Tom McCabe plus further home internationals Tom White, George Tyson, Alf Wood, James Lomas and Billy Longworth.

Never again would Oldham dominate the game for such a period of time although the 1920s Challenge Cup kings and the 1950s League, Lancashire Cup and Championship winners would run them close.

THE 2018 Ladbrokes Challenge Cup final at Wembley will go down in history for French club Catalans Dragons' famous victory over Warrington Wolves and the award of the Lance Todd Trophy as man of the match to Dragons' full-back Tony Gigot, the first Frenchman to lift that iconic piece of silverware.

#### Coventry Bears were formed in 1998 by a group of university students, led by their current owner and CEO Alan Robinson.

Coventry Rugby Union club were approached with a plan to form a team playing home games at their Coundon Road stadium in Coventry. The Bears were admitted into the Rugby League Conference for the 2000 season.

Early successes brought the new club quarterfinal and then semi-final placings in their first two seasons before winning the Rugby League Conference Grand Final in September 2002 when they beat Hemel Stags at Cheltenham.

Elevation to the newly formed National League Three followed and the Bears duly went on to win the National League Three Grand Final in 2004.

Coundon Road stadium was demolished in 2004 which saw the Bears follow their sister Rugby Union club across Coventry to the newly constructed Butts Park Arena and its impressive 3000 seater East Stand.

2006 saw Coventry become a Rugby League Conference Midlands Premier side and they continued to enjoy success, winning the Midlands Premier title in 2007.

The Bears were accepted into the semi-professional ranks of League 1 in 2015. In the first four games of the season Coventry would make the trip to Whitebank Stadium to face Oldham three times. Defeats in the iPRO Sport Cup and Challenge Cup followed before losing their second league fixture 38-10 against the promotion chasing Roughyeds.

The Bears and Oldham wouldn't cross paths again for three years as the Roughyeds would spend two seasons in the Championship and Coventry continued to make progress in League 1.

The 2018 season has seen the Bears win 6 out of 22 league games. The



most notable success came in round 18 where they defeated Keighley Cougars 30-20 at Butts Park - it was the first time the side had beaten a traditional heartland club. The result was a complete turnaround since the West Yorkshire side had inflicted a 98-6 defeat on the Bears at Cougar Park earlier in the season.

Oldham made their first ever visit to Coventry in June when Scott Naylor's side pulled off a 60-0 win. The game was played out in good spirit which drew the

applause of the travelling Oldham supporters, appreciative of the effort applied by the Bears.

Last time out, Coventry won away at West Wales Raiders, taking the spoils 28-18.

Points are vital at this business end of the season and Coventry will be keen to record a first win against the Roughyeds. It should be a great game.
