An occasional short punt is effective when the 3/4 line of the opposition is lying close to your own 3/4 line (and this is every match nowadays). It helps to drive them back. Accuracy is necessary — essential — otherwise the short punt is useless. Well ours were cleverly done and the kicker often got up in time to gather the ball on the mark.
