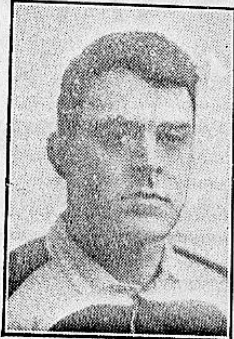
"BOB" SLOMAN'S OPINION.
