The Secretary was also supported by the Treasurer, Mr. A. Mr. Tom Mallett, a member of the Welsh Rugby League Commission, and Mr. John Wilson, Leeds, the Secretary of the Rugby League, also addressed the meeting and gave a very amusing speech relative to other Clubs who play our game in the North of England. The Committee of the Supporters' Club are very earnest and hard working in their endeavours especially in extending the membership of the Club, and this week meetings are being held at Caerphilly, Porth, Tonypany, Mountain Ash, Abercynon and other places so that Sub-Committees can be formed with the main object in view of extending the ranks of the Supporters' Club and increasing its membership.
