EDITORIAL NOTES.

The County Cup Final Tie.

After an interval of twelve years, we in Oldham, are once more honoured by being allowed to "house" a final tie of firstclass importance. Not since April, 1915, when Huddersfield trounced St. Helens to the extent of 37 points to three in the final tie for the Rugby League Challenge Cup, have we had a first-class final at Watersheddings. And even after that long interval there have been any amount of "grousers" at the action of the County Committee allocating to us the game. However, we feel confident that we shall be able to provide an excellent playing pitch for the two contesting teams, and, so far as the spectators are concerned, we can shelter more than any other club in Lancashire; whilst as regards the holding capacity of the ground we feel sure that we can accommodate quite as large a crowd as any that has so far witnessed a County Cup final, and what is more, all who get on the ground will be able to witness the play. We trust that when the game is over, our would-be detractors will have found that there was little, if any, cause for their anxiety on account of Watersheddings being the venue.

The Two Finalists.

Two very popular teams are to-day contesting for the handsome Cup and the accompanying medals. Swinton and Wigan are two names to conjure with. They immediately bring up visions of many famous victories achieved by both teams. In Cup-tie warfare, Wigan have perhaps been the most successful: but in recent seasons Swinton have deservedly come to the front, and have established themselves very firmly in the public favour by the consistent manner in which they expounded the open game. Seeing that Wigan are also adepts at this class of play, we should to-day see a really brilliant game.

How They Reached the Final.

Both Swinton and Wigan have had fairly difficult obstacles to overcome in reaching this

Personalities in To-day's Came.

We shall have some interesting personalities on view in to-day's game. The Wigan club has long been noted for their enterprise in searching for talent, and have succeeded in recruiting from nearly every part of the globe where Rugby football is played. To-day they are probably the most cosmopolitan team that ever graced a football ground, including, as it does, players from New Zealand, South Africa, England, Scotland and Wales. The average follower of the game, however, cares not where a player comes from so long as he sees good football, and for a good many seasons the Wigan club has obliged in that respect. In their full back, Jim Sullivan, they have a custodian, who, although comparatively a youth, has already secured every honour possible in Rugby League football, including a place in the last touring team in Australasia. He is probably the most versatile and brilliant full back playing the game to-day. We shall probably have a peep at the three New Zealanders whom the Central Park organisation secured during the close season, immediately the ban was removed. These are B. Davidson, the centre threequarter back from Auckland, New Zealand, the town which supplied Oldham with the famous G. W. Smith. Davidson was generally 'looked Zealanders last season.

Brown, wing threequarter, also of Auckland, and L. Mason, forward, of Christchurch, were also members of the last touring team. Then they have R. M. Kinnear, the Scotch International threequarter back; Johnny Ring, a well-known performer at Watersheddings; W. J. Booysen, half back, of Paarl, South Africa; C. W. Van Rooyen, a famous forward from Stynberg, South Africa; and also another Colonial threequarter back in the person of W. F. Oliver, from Johannesburg. Apparently the Wigan club have a wealth of talent to select from, but whether they can place on the field thirteen players who can cope successfully with Swinton is quite another matter. Wigan had a bit of a shock at Broughton last Saturday, where the Rangers succeeded in beating them. Have they recovered from that shock?

on paper, Swinton may not appear so rich in talent as their opponents; but nevertheless they have a very capable and brilliant list of players to choose from. There may, perhaps, not be so many "stars," but at the same time Swinton can place a team on the field capable of showing all that is best in our game.
