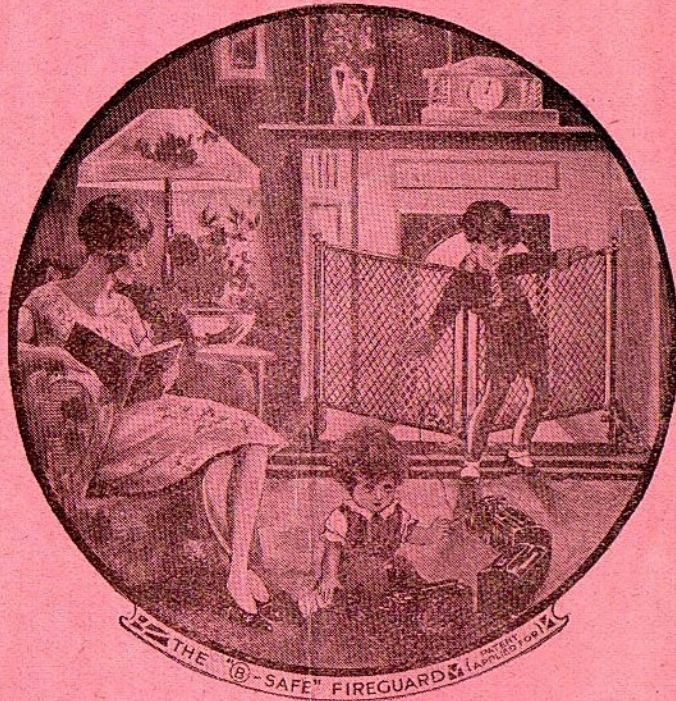

CLUB NOTES.—Saturday, November 17th. 1928

The Match with Wigan Highfield.—The result of this game was very pleasing and a win of 16 points to nothing, in spite of our not getting possession of the ball, was quite refreshing. The combination spirit returned to our players again and the result was that tries were scored. F. SOUTHWARD was not able to turn out owing to the death of his father (in which loss all of us tender our sincerest sympathy), and W. DAVIES had to be brought into the team (although he had previously "cried off" the "A" team through indisposition). This latter handicap caused some criticism of his play in the first half by those who did not know the full facts, but his two tries in the second half silenced even the critics. It was a convincing win.

Widnes 5 points, Salford Nil.—We ought to have won this match and that would have been a great feather in our cap. It was not lost until the last few minutes, the score being nil for both sides until the Widnes half-back dropped a goal. The try that was scored on time would probably never have been scored if the rather lucky dropped goal hadn't been successful. The Widnes supporters said Salford were the best team that had been there this season. What is more, we had a try disallowed, A. CASEWELL'S keen following up, culminating in a dramatic and wonderful dive for the ball, touching down for a try before the Widnes defender made it dead, but the

Referee had evidently heard about the remarkable sequence of disallowed tries by Salford this year and decided not to spoil our record! We are not saying that the team gave a wonderful performance or anything like that—we got the ball out about four times all the afternoon, and B. HUDSON got one pass. The redeeming feature was the play of S. BOYD, L. WILLIAMS and A. MIDDLETON. S. BOYD cut through beautifully twice and beat the opposition and with proper support we should have been points up. L. WILLIAMS played an heroic game at full-back and was a team in himself in both defence and attack; and as regards A. MIDDLETON (of whom we give some notes later on) well to see a good terrier shake rats is child's-play compared with what this man will be doing when he really settles down and is fully conversant with the game. We had memories of EVAN THOMAS at his best, as he dashed through with Widnes players clinging on to him, but not stopping his progress. He is a fine tackler and can handle the ball well. It was no mean performance to lose by so narrow a margin at Widnes on the last minute. The game comprised three factors instead of two—Widnes, Salford, and the Referee (with a Whistle). Everyone knew he had a whistle and it was more in evidence than any player on the field.
