AN EXTRA ENTRANCE TO OUR GROUND.

It is not generally known that whenever we have a very big match at Wilderspool there is an additional entrance to the Reserve Side, and this turnstile is situated at the bottom of the road, behind the Grand Stand, and at the Railway end of the ground. This entrance opens out on to a splendid terrace, from which it is possible to get a grand view of the whole of the field, and we would advise late-comers to go round to this turnstile and save themselves the trouble of having to bore their way through the crowd.

CUP FINALS.

There have been 12 Cup Finals at Headingley, three at Rochdale, two each at Huddersfield, Wigan, Salford, Broughton, and Fallowfield, and one each at Oldham, Halifax, and Wakefield. The largest attendance was recorded at Rochdale in April, 1924, when 41,831 people paid £3,712 13s. 4d. to see Wigan beat Oldham.

CUP-TIE NOTES.

The actual figures at the Leeds match were: Spectators, 22,587; receipts, £1,386.

The Warrington ground record is 25,440, who paid £1,774, on the occasion of the Northern Rugby League Cup Final between St. Helens Recs. and Swinton.

Warrington and Oldham were the last two clubs left in the hat on the occasion of the draw for the Second Round, and our number was 13, which was not so unlucky after all.
