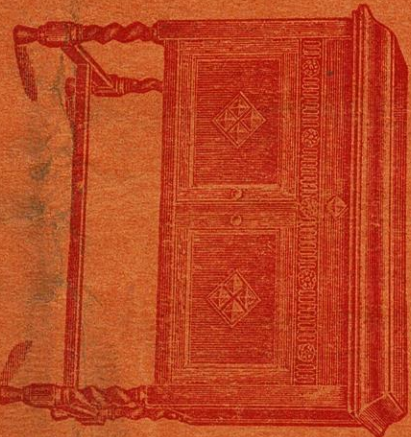

Brogden's possibilities were realized when at the age of fifteen he became a member of the Bradford Northern Supporters' 14-16 team, engaged in the Yorkshire Inter-towns' League. At the age of sixteen Brogden played his first game with the 'Northern' 1st XIII against Huddersfield at Fartown, and he acquitted himself very well on the wing in that match.
