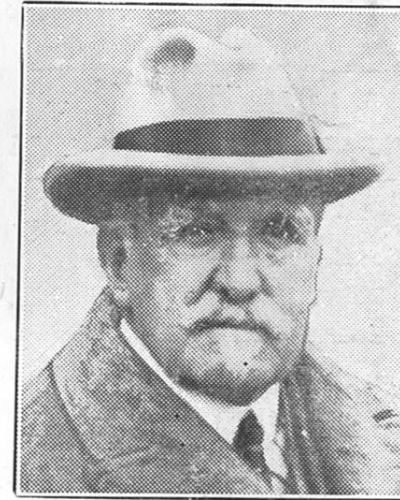

A Short Synopsis of the Life, Aims and Objects of the Hunslet C.F. & A. Supporters' Club.

The original founders of the above had a lot to contend with, when they first formed the Hunslet C.F. & A. Supporters' Club in June, 1922, as they were no doubt looked upon as an alien body to the Senior Club, but after seven years' useful work they are now looked upon as the title inferers, SUPPORTERS.

The chief aim and object at its foundation was to help all branches of the Hunslet Club, and amongst their achievements during the past seven years are:—

- Having had made New Terracing for the Football Section.
- Supplying New Railings and Painting them (Football Section).
- Supplying New Flag and Pole.
- Supplying New Forms for the Cricket Section.
- Supplying New Scoring Tent for the Cricket Section.
- Assisting Bowling Section financially.

And, above all, gradually training and developing local boys from School Football and so saving the Senior Club many pounds.

These useful attainments have now been surpassed by what may be termed the greatest achievement of their career, namely, the covering of the old stand.

The reasons for covering this stand was, owing to a debt on the old covered stand, which every Club supporter was of the opinion should be paid, but the trouble was: How could it be paid? Like all other Clubs, Hunslet have had their lean times, and were short of the money to do it with.

Various schemes were thought of, but were found impracticable. It was then thought by the Supporters that if they covered the old stand, spectators in wet weather would be only too pleased to pay 6d. and remain dry whilst watching their old favourites try and entertain them. This would then be an extra source of revenue to the Club, which could be devoted to the redemption of the overwhelming debt.

The Supporters, to attain this object, then had to find means of raising the necessary money to cover the expense which would have to be incurred, and decided on a Workshop Competition, which was immediately put into operation, thanks to the gracious offer of Mr. Eli Jacobson, the old Yorkshire forward, who kindly came forward when the scheme was launched, and became the Donor of a Cup which was finally won the first season by the Leeds City Tramways in a keen and exciting Final with the Leeds Fruit Market.

Thanks to the organisation of Mr. H. Whiteley, ably supported by the Supporters' Secretary, Mr. M. C. Gregg, and his Committee of fellow-workers, this was a huge success, the handsome profit of £260 being realised from this, which along with monies raised from other schemes, made a total of £300, and so we were enabled to proceed with our scheme of covering the old stand, and we hope that all true and ardent supporters will rally round and show their appreciation by packing the stand every match and so enable the latter part of the scheme to be carried out. That is: THE REDEMPTION OF THE DEBT ON THE BIG STAND.

Last, but not least, is, although we raised the magnificent sum of £300 last year, we did not raise enough.

The handsome cover which has been erected has cost £700, and the supporters have now to set out to raise the difference, and are opening a Subscription List with this object. We wish to thank all who gave us their support during our last Workshop Competition, and also take this opportunity of thanking them prematurely for their support which, we hope, they will favour us with during our **next Workshop Competition**, details of which will be published later in the season, as when we have finished paying for this Cover we have still other schemes to launch which, we think, are for the betterment of the Club and so keep the old Chocolate and White Flag flying.
