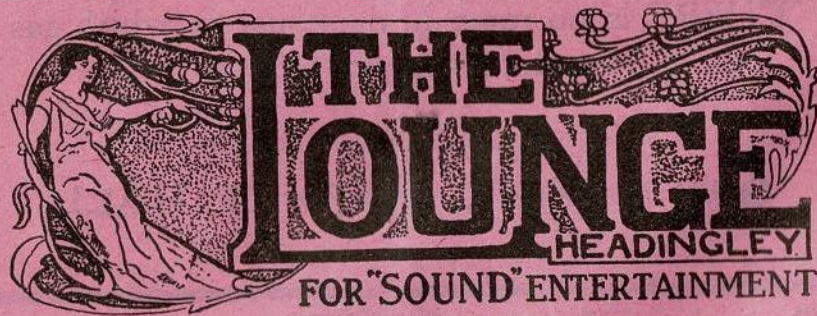

There would be promotion and relegation. The top clubs at the end of each season in Division 2 and 3 would ascend to Division 1 and 2 respectively, and the bottom clubs in Division 1 and 2 would be relegated to Division 2 and 3 respectively. Two points for a win and one point for a draw.

These Divisions would dispense with the play-off of the first four top clubs in the League, and also would dispense with the Yorkshire and Lancashire Leagues. Medals would only be given to the top club in Division 1.

The Merits of the Proposed Scheme.

1. By having three divisions the results of the matches will in most cases be in doubt right to the end of the game, as the clubs will be more evenly matched. This means spectators will have more interest in the games and

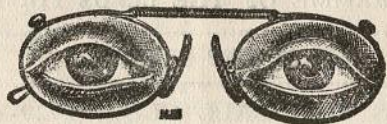

League games, played 8, won 5, lost 2, drawn 1, 68.75% : position fifth in League.

Let us look at their position on April 14th,

League games, played 31, won 9, lost 18, drawn 4, 35.48% : position 24th in League.

The reason for this drop in the table is their fixtures after the first two months were with the clubs who would chiefly be in the First or Second Divisions with the result that now they occupy a lowly position in the League, and their gates have suffered. That brings my point home that it would be better for the lowly clubs to meet each other and thereby have the opportunity given them for promotion, the clubs being evenly matched, and the clubs would gain financially.

2. The problem of promotion and relegation will keep the interest in the game alive to the end of the football season. The clubs with this object in view

will make the games from the spectators' point of view most interesting and I feel confident the players themselves will play with a keener spirit.

What do we find to-day, over 50% of the clubs the spectators have no interest at all in the games during the last two months of the season.

3. The percentage system is abolished.

4. The clubs in each division play the same number of matches, and therefore we are enabled to give two points for a win and one for a draw.

In conclusion I ask for the suggested scheme to be given serious consideration, as one feels something must be done to alleviate the financial position of some of the clubs. We must bring more interest into our game, thus creating more interest to our followers. The present system has had a long trial and it has now been found too unwieldy and in the majority of cases the matches too one-sided.

May I finally refer to the point of each club in each division playing each other four times, two home and two away. This probably sounds unique, but this system is applied by the leading Rugby Union clubs in Wales, viz., Cardiff, Swansea, Newport, and Llanelly, who meet each other four times every season.

Our opponents to-day are Oldham, and the match is a vital one to both clubs, as the defeated club will lose whatever chance it had of finishing in the first four.

Leeds are seventh in the table, having played 37 matches, won 22, lost 13, drawn 2, percentage 62.16, and Oldham are tenth in the League, having played 34 matches, won 18, lost 12, drawn 4, percentage 58.79.

The first meeting of Leeds and Oldham this season was at Watersheddings on Saturday, April 12th, when Leeds were defeated by 1 goal, 2 tries, 8 points, to 1 try, 3 points. It was very unfortunate from Leeds point of view, that, owing to the call of the Glamorgan and Monmouth County, and injuries, six

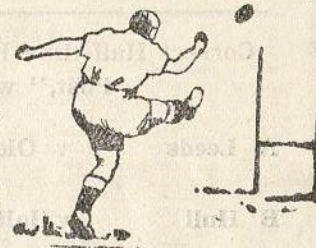

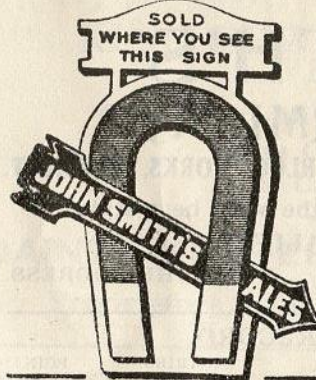
