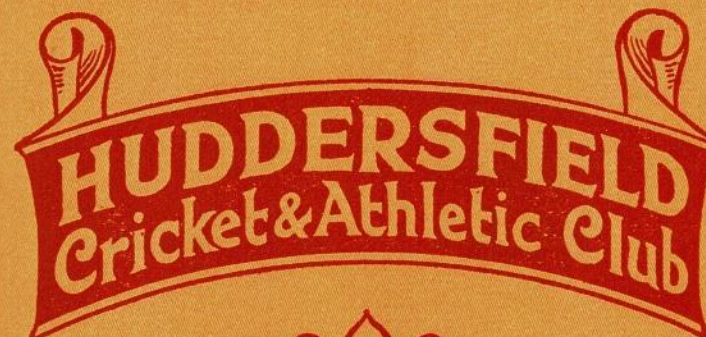

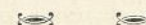

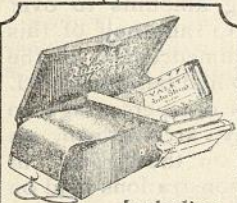

THE LEEDS MATCH.

August 30th was a great opening of the League season at Fartown. The weather, fortunately, was not quite so tropical as on the few days preceding, else the deferring of the kick off from afternoon until early evening would probably have needed serious consideration. As it was, the players were called to face a 'hot time,' and physical fitness was likely to play a big part in deciding the issue.

In bringing off a great victory, to the extent of 25 points to 8,

our team deserve heartiest congratulations. To the vanquished side, no little sympathy is called for by reason of the severe handicap under which they laboured during 70 minutes of the game. Only 10 minutes had passed, when Smith, the Leeds International winger, was unfortunate enough to sustain a collar-bone injury which caused his retirement from the game. Up to that point, the Headingley men had held their own in all phases of the game. Then Jenkins was removed from the pack to take up the vacated wing position, and not until just over half-an-hour had passed did we succeed in breaking down the Leeds defence. Then an unconverted try by Brogden opened the scoring, only to be followed, ere half-time, by a try to the opposition, and the conversion gave the visitors a lead of two points (5-3) at the interval.

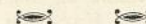

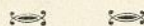
