Welsby had the honour of scoring two tries against his former club. Few hookers can claim to have scored two tries in a match.

Roy Kinnear, who has been off through injury for a long time, was one of the three-quarters selected for the "A" team match at Oldham to-day. Our "A" team is well in the running for the championship.

Oldham, our opponents to-day, are not far behind us in the League table. It is nine years since they were successful at Central Park. On February 3rd, 1923, they won by a point.

On the other hand, Wigan have not won at Watersheddings since December, 1920, and Oldham have had much the better of the argument in the inter-club matches since the formation of the Northern Union.

Our next home match is against Hunstlet on January 30th, and on the following Saturday the cup ties begin.
