Oldham, our opponents to-day, are doing well this season and will doubtless give our team a keen game.

Since the war period Wigan and Oldham have met 36 times. Each club has won 16 games, and there have been four draws.

Last season at Central Park, Wigan beat Oldham by 39 points to 5, but lost at Watersheddings (where their last success was on December 11th, 1920) by 23 points to 12.

Sol. Oakley, our reserve full back, has begun training again. He has not played since his accident last season.
