OUR record up-to-date is much below what we expected. Four points from the first five matches—three of which were at home—is about as bad a start as Wigan have made for a good many years.

Warrington, who were in fine form last Saturday, recorded their biggest score against us since the formation of the Northern Union.

Jack Morley has proved that he has the pace and skill to score many tries, but he must not have to forage for the ball. He must be given plenty of passes, and we have no doubt he will do the rest.

Our forward play has not been up to the Central Park standard this season, and this has had an effect on the work of the backs. We are out to strengthen weak places.

Jim Sullivan's return was never more anxiously awaited, and we have no doubt his numerous admirers will give him a great ovation after his success as captain of the Touring team.

Sullivan has established another record, that of kicking over a hundred goals on tour.

With Sullivan's return and the arrival shortly of Gee and Wilson, the Australian backs, Wigan should go ahead.

Oldham, our opponents to-day, are doing well this season, and will doubtless give our team a keen game.

Since the war period Wigan and Oldham have met 36 times. Each club has won 16 games, and there have been four draws.

Last season, at Central Park, Wigan beat Oldham by 39 points to 5, but lost at Watersheddings (where their last success was on December 11th, 1920) by 23 points to 12.

Sol. Oakley, our reserve full back, has begun training again. He has not played since his accident last season.
