EDITORIAL NOTES.

RUGBY LEAGUE IN PARIS.—For the match arranged in Paris on Sunday, December 31st, England v. Australia, the Rugby League Council have arranged a special excursion, below a few of the particulars.

The train leaves Wakefield Westgate on Saturday, December 30th, at 5-53 p.m., arrive Kings Cross 9-25 p.m. Dinner on train to London. Arriving in London, passengers will be conveyed to Victoria where the departure will be 11-0 p.m. to Folkstone, we then leave Folkstone 1-15 a.m. Sunday, December 31st and arrive Dunkeque 5-30 a.m., departing from there 6-15 a.m. and with breakfast on train we arrive Paris at 10-0 a.m. when you will be taken to hotel ready for luncheon. In the afternoon all will be conveyed by motor coach to the match and back to the hotel for tea. The return journey will be made from Paris at 8-5 p.m. arriving Folkstone 5-55 a.m. on Jan. 1st, after breakfast which will be served on train, you arrive London 7-40 a.m. and make your own arrangements for travelling north. The cost of the trip is £5-17-6 which includes tips, etc. reserved seats on train, berths on steamer subject to accommodation being available, all meals en route; transfer from station to hotel and vice-versa, in Paris from hotel to football ground and back and between Kings Cross and Victoria Station, London.

You can also book to return on Monday, January 1st. The fare for this, including hotel accommodation is £7-0-0.

Anyone wishing to make the journey, booking arrangements, etc. can be made by application to J. A. Hall, 95, Bradford Road, Wakefield, who if you cannot call on him, drop a P.C. and he will call on you at your convenience and give you further particulars should you require them.

The charges of admission to the match are 5, 10, 15 or 20 Francs.

Len. Higon, a worthy son of a worthy father. First started playing football as a schoolboy with Featherstone George Street, taking to the game “like a duck does to water,” he soon forged ahead and was selected to play for the County Schoolboys, he afterwards assisted “Sutcliffe’s” (a well known local club) and signed on for Trinity in the season 1928-29, this being his sixth season. His position is front row forward at present, but formerly he was a second man and it is a doubtful point which is his best position. Opinions on the matter are many and varied, but in his enthusiasm for the game, we think Len is unconcerned where he is playing so long as he plays. Good alike in the scrummage and in the loose, and a very conscientious player, no one doubts but that he has earned his place amongst the “big noises” of the Rugby League. He has played in one International Match, for England against Wales, and has played for Yorkshire several times, as recently as Wednesday last, he played against Cumberland at Dewsbury, he was reserve in the Second Test at Headingley, and is reserve for the last Test at Swinton. As he is only 24 years of age, he should be a very valuable asset to Trinity for a good long period, we sincerely hope so. Stands 5 feet 11½ inches and 14 stones.
