### CLUB CHAT

We have already met Oldham, our visitors to-day, this season at Watersheddings, where the home side won by 18 pts. to 8 pts. The clubs did not meet last season, but in 1931-32 the Parksiders achieved the "double," winning 20 pts. to 5 pts. at home and by 20 pts. to 10 pts. at Oldham. In 1930-31 it was the Lancashire club's turn to achieve the "double," winning by 3 pts. to 0 (a), and 6 pts. to 3 pts. (b). The position of the clubs in the League up to and including Saturday last was as follows:—

Whilst Oldham may be expected to provide stern opposition, the Parksiders should be able to strengthen their position in the League table.

The match at Salford last week-end provided a thrilling struggle, and Hunslet (minus Walkington and Winter) are to be complimented on playing the League Leaders to two points. Hunslet's score is the highest number of points recorded at Weaste this season. The next best is 10 points scored by St. Helens, with the Australians and Wakefield Trinity 9 points each.

Hunslet met Leigh in the Cup Competition as far back as 1904. The encounter took place at Leigh, and Hunslet won 8 pts. to 0. The Clubs were paired again in 1912, once more at Leigh, when the home side were victorious by 13 pts. to 0. In season 1905-6, Leigh won the League Championship with Hunslet as runners-up. The Lancashire Club also won the Rugby League Challenge Cup in 1921, when they beat Halifax 13 pts. to 0. Last season Leigh were defeated in the 1st round at Warrington by 34 pts. to 3 pts, but in the previous season our Cup-Tie opponents

We should not be satisfied to be simple like driftwood in the ocean, tossed anywhere without any sense of control, or ultimate destiny. All we ask for is a fair crack of the whip.
