

Unfortunately Saturday's games were marked with a few rather serious accidents, some of which may have vital bearings on both this week-end cup-ties, and also upon the Australian tour. Another serious accident occurred in the St. Helens Recs. v. Castleford game, where the cup-holders were unexpectedly beaten. When we were listening-in to the recent broadcast of Visitors. to-day's cup draw we were naturally feeling a trifle disturbed when so many names had come out and we had not heard the word "Owdham." Then, when the draw was nearing its completion the news flashed through, pronounced more prettily and correctly. There was only a few seconds elapsed before our name was followed by "Wigan." It is understood that every one in Oldham who was listening-in jumped up and treated himself to an extra cup of tea. before leaving his house to celebrate the luck of the draw elsewhere with his friends. Given fine weather we expect all records to be broken. In the season 1911-12 (?) we had a tremendous crowd when Wigan visited us. In that season we knocked out both Wigan and Huddersfield. We beat the latter club twice in a fortnight (League and cup) and then Wigan, and Wigan returned the compliment by coming and beating us in the League. We well remember the scenes which there were at Watersheddings. Let's hope we may see a game worthy of the two clubs and worthy of the occasion, and one which will leave no regrets.


