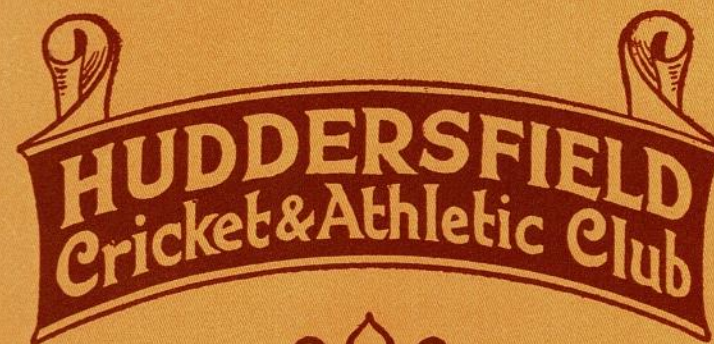

OFFICIAL NOTES.

Though our Programme in connection with this afternoon's return engagement with Oldham makes reference to quite a number of interesting and highly important items of recent date, it is unfortunate that, since our last home victory over Bramley, we have to record two successive League defeats away from home. Thus, a reference to our present day position in the table makes very bad reading indeed. What else can be expected when from the 23 matches played our premier side has won 8 only, with a drawn game, making a sum total of 17 points. Of the other Yorkshire Clubs only Hull Kingston, Featherstone and Bramley are below us.

Because of the undoubted uplift experienced this season in many other Yorkshire centres, i.e. Hunslet, Bradford N., Wakefield and in the Heavy Woollen District, this Fartown slump has been brought into still greater prominence. Locally, and much farther afield, people have long been enquiring 'What's wrong at Fartown'? The question might well be asked when we recollect that of the five home

engagements fulfilled since the Australian match at Fartown on November 20th last, four of these were lost in a row, with Bramley affording the one victory to us three weeks ago.

To become more searching still, it is to be recorded that of our last 8 League games played since Nov. 20th, only two have been won.

Serious injuries to players at one part or another of the season, and loss of form on the part of others have been contributory factors in our premier team's lack of success on the field. 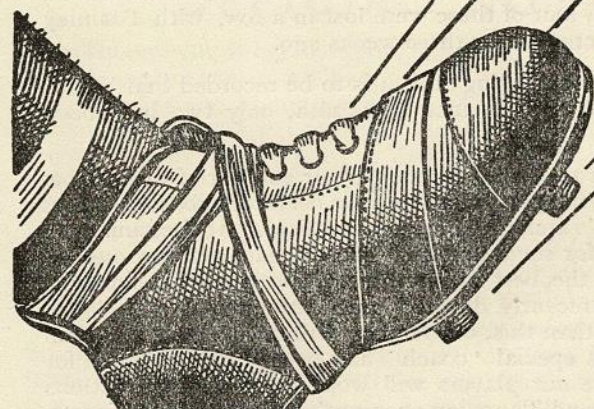

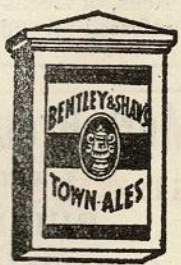

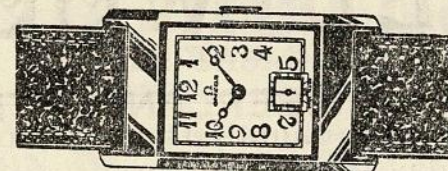
