OFFICIAL NOTES.

* * * * * *

To-day sees the final curtain rung down on the Fartown football season 1945-46 with the Third Annual Seven-a-side Tournament arranged by our club. Our previous stagings of this popular form of Rugby League football have proved a great success and a glance at the teams and players participating in this afternoon's event suggests that past standards will be well maintained. We welcome all visiting players and officials and hope they will enjoy an afternoon's sport in which injuries will find no place.

We had hoped to greet Fiddes and his men as Rugby League Champions, but events at Maine Road last Saturday decreed otherwise and we have to be satisfied with the honour of having reached the Final. Wigan are to be congratulated on a success they earned, not only last Saturday, but throughout the season. To our lads we say, "Hard lines, and better luck next time." It is very disappointing to be so near, and vet so far, but we are confident that next season will see the Claret and Gold among the honours once more.

Meanwhile, we hope the "Seven" who are wearing the Fartown jerseys to-day, both here and at the Warrington Tournament, will worthily uphold our great reputation in seven-a-side football. A delve through our records in previous "Sevens" competitions shows that very rarely has a Fartown "Seven" failed to reach the Final stage, and of the last seven competitions entered five were won.

Our leading scorer during the past season was Bawden, with 250 points (92 goals and 22 tries) in 44 matches. (Only Ben Gronow and Major Holland have surpassed this season points total in days gone by). The regrettable injury Bawden sustained during the Salford match (which kept him out of the game at Swinton) prevented him from joining the select band of Fartowners who have gone through a season without missing a match: Other principal scorers were Fiddes 15 goals, 30 tries (120 points), Anderson 17 tries (51 points), Robson 3 goals, 12 tries (42 points), W. T. Davies 12 goals, 5 tries (39 points), Burrow and Todd each 10 tries (30 points).

RULES.

Games are played under Rugby League Rules. Each game is played seven and a half minutes each way, and if at the end of such play neither side has won, ends are changed and continue to be changed at the end of seven and a half minutes, the first side to score is the winner. If a try is scored before the bell rings time is allowed for the goal kick. No interval is allowed in the event of extra time being played. There will be an interval of 15 minutes after the last semi-final. The final will consist of 10 minutes each way with no interval. No substitute will be allowed during the progress of any game. No player who has not played in a previous round can take part in the final. An injured player in the First Round may be substituted. No interval at half-time.
