

In the meantime, our local boy, and "A" team hooker, J. Mundy, is doing exceptionally well, and is sure to make the grade in first class football.

Much has been stated in the press about this club having a full team on the transfer list, but two of the players, W. Griffiths and V. Kenny have now applied to have their names removed from the list, and this has been readily

agreed to by the Committee.
