It is to their benefit also that progress should be made, and with this end in view special training will take place at Watersheddings, and the fact that our Captain and President will be watching our opponents in action to-day for our future plans.


The object is a worthy one and will assist materially in raising the standard of physical fitness of our future citizens, and will encourage the love of sport which has long been a characteristic of the British people.
