Whether this relief can be passed on to the public is a problem, as charges and wages are all on the upgrade, and even at Watersheddings to charge a 1/- gate would involve this club in a loss of £500 revenue calculated upon the attendances we have had this season. Money, they say, talks, and a great amount of money is required to finance a club, as evidenced by the large amounts that are paid in transfer fees for class players.
