ON top of the world now eh? Batley, the leading Yorkshire team in the Rugby League, and should still be in that position after to-days match. I hope I am not being too optimistic, and am not going to be let down. Oldham have always been a team capable of springing a surprise, and few teams have been keener opponents in the past than Batley and Oldham, especially in cup-ties. The forwards were more agile in the open and the new men were impressive. There is still too much kicking to lose possession and if the flanks are not better covered there will be trouble, especially against a fast side.

Next home match is with Leeds on November 20th, Kick off 2-30.


