

#### **CLUB NEWS**

Indeed to-day is a red letter day as we are playing the seventh Australian Touring Team to visit this country and, thanks to the authorities concerned, we have been allocated a Saturday match for each visit.

No matter what the result of to-day's match is we hope that we shall be treated to see Rugby League football at its best. Of course all teams are out to beat the Australians, and each match that they play they are up against the cup-tie spirit; however much as we would like our team to come out of the game with victory, the game will be played in the sporting spirit which we expect and on the day's play may the best team win.

It may be of interest to readers that there are no full-time professionals in Australian Rugby League football. They are really amateurs who receive a season's bonus at the end of each season according to the "gates", and they only play about half the normal English season.

Through the courtesy of our Mayor (Councillor S. Thornton) they have this morning been accorded a civic reception at the Town Hall and this evening this club entertains them to dinner at the Town Hall, when each member of the party will be presented with a silver serviette ring with the Town's coat of arms embossed and the name of each individual inscribed thereon.

Later in the evening they proceed to Hill Stores as the guests of our Supporters' Club to the dance they have arranged in their honour.

Later they return to the headquarters at Ilkley and we hope they will leave us with pleasant memories of their visit to Oldham.

#### DO YOU KNOW

That the first touring team of 1908 from Australia, the net receipts for the tour were only £4,995 2s. 0d. and the expenses of the tour £5,340 1s. 8d. Compared with the expenses of 1948 tour which are estimated at £24,000 and the receipts have amply covered this up to the present time.

That the best gate of the 1908 tour of the Australians was £283 16s. 0d. at the second test at Newcastle-on-Tyne. The visitors' share of the takings at the first test at St. James' Park, London amounted to £22 1s. 2d. and the third test at Birmingham, to £107 5s. 3d.

That at Widnes the Australians got £17 5s. 1d. out of the "gate" and at Glasgow their share totalled £32 15s. 4d.

In regard to the first test match, it might be mentioned that it cost £40 to transport the team to London from their headquarters in Southport.
