WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS.

The strenuous Easter programme of matches is now over, and of the three league matches played we were only successful in winning one match, and that away, against Rochdale Hornets.

Our match against Salford, at Watersheddings on Good Friday, resulted in a narrow victory for our visitors by eight points to five points. Whilst appreciating the play of Salford, especially at half-back, we consider that we could have won this match had the opportunities presented been taken advanage of. Too many matches in so few days has taken its toll with injuries to players; we have had Leyland, Platt and Mitchell put out of action; also we have missed the services of Heyes during the matches owing to a pulled muscle also Ogden has now finished for the season, having gone to work abroad, temporarily. All these players we can call recognised first team players, and replacements are very hard to make. Our Welsh forward, Winslade, is also out of action for the season with a broken collar bone. This injury happened against Hornets "A" at Watersheddings, on Saturday last. However, it is a very lucky team that can keep a clean medical sheet during holiday matches.

The one bright feature of the holiday matches at Watersheddings was the good "gate" against Salford on Good Friday; the highest receipts of the season for a league match. This amounted to £1,194 198. 6d. A few more gate receipts like this and the club would soon be in a healthy financial position, and could compete in purchasing value with the best clubs in the league.

OUR VISITORS.

In our last first team home match of the season we are pleased to entertain our visitors from Workington, and expect to have a real good game, with ultimate victory going to our team.

Workington are in a slightly better position than ourselves, having played 34 matches, won 20, lost 13 and drawn 1; points for 475, points against 303, league points 41; against our own record of having played 32 matches, won 15, lost 13 and drawn 4; points for 373, points against 355, league points 34.

The Workington team to-day comprises of 8 Cumbrians, in Gibson, Graham, McAvoy, Cavanah, McKeating, Hayton, Telford and Ivison; 2 Australians: Paskins and Mudge; 2 Welshmen: Risman and Thomas; 1 Lancastrian: Lawrenson. The captain, Gus Risman, needs no introduction; besides playing, is manager of the club; has had a long playing career, and has gained every bonour the game can offer to him.
