

#### WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS.

It was with mixed feelings that we received the result of our match at Batley on Saturday last, after expectations of another victory, but this was not to be, even allowing for the forced changes in the team, the whole side had an off day, the forwards in particular baing ineffective, and unable to get the passing machinery in action, which we know the team is capable of. This variation of form is a puzzle; a team will play badly when they are expected to perform brilliantly, and the same team will show great form one day and poor form another. How is this to be explained, and more important still, how is it to be avoided? It is natural that the team which we follow, and which one is associated with, want them to win, and however much we pride ourselves upon sportsmanship which accepts defeat, and to acknowledge the skill of the victors there is bound to be some measure of disappointment if defeat has been due to bad play. How are we to avoid bad play, for the sting is in that and not in the defeat itself? We are not so much concerned that the team should lose a match—even the best of teams are defeated—but we are greatly concerned if they play poor football. And so we try to find an explanation of these unexpected reverses—these surprising falls from excellence to badness, from brilliance to blundering. To avoid these disconcerting variations from greatness to mediocrity we must seek the causes and remedy them. One wonders if too many matches are arranged in the early part of the season. We have played eight matches in the first four weeks of the season. Is there a danger of staleness affecting individual players by taking part in too many matches?

Good news was received at Watersheddings on Wednesday morning from our player Harry Ogden, who has been working in Ghent, Belgium, to the effect that he was returning to this country. Harry reported for training on Thursday last, and we shall soon see this excellent forward in action again.
