## CLUB NOTES

The long list of injuries continues to grow and probably never in its long history has the Club been so badly hit. Even worse than the disappointment caused to supporters by last week's crushing defeat at Featherstone, when we fully expected to win, and which was the heaviest since that at Swinton (37-0), in November, 1947, was two further additions to the injury list. Creaney broke his collar bone and Ivor Davies was put out of action, although it is expected he will soon be fit again.

At present we have only two forwards remaining of the mighty pack which so distinguished itself in the latter half of last season, and in this season's early games. These are Mulhall and Callaghan, and the difficulty is that Brereton, Britton and Bedford are not likely to be available for some weeks.

Meanwhile the directors are doing all in their power to remedy the present deficiencies and there should be new faces in the pack to-day. There is no doubt we will miss the penetrative skill of Creaney in the backs against to-days visitors who are close on the heels of Wigan and Warrington at the top of the table.

It is therefore good news that Ivill is fit again. To-day's game is certain to be a close affair, all the more so since we have a home immunity of defeat in league games which goes back to 3rd December last year. If the standard of football equals that displayed by both sides in the last home game against Salford our supporters should have little cause for complaint.
