LEEDS v. OLDHAM. Rugby League Challenge Cup, First Round, First Leg. This afternoon we entertain Oldham in the First Leg of the First Round of the Rugby League Challenge Cup Competition for Season 1950-51. The last occasion we played Oldham in cup-tie football was during the "Emergency" Cup Competition in Season 1941-42, and in a two-legged semi-final we were successful by 5-2 at Headingley, and in the second leg a week later we won at the Water-sheddings by 12-3. In this match we were assisted by Gus Risman and Edwards, the Salford wing pair, and Oliver Morris, our stand-off-half scored a beautiful try under the posts after Billy Stott (who later captained Wakefield Trinity in a Rugby League Cup Final at Wembley) had dropped the ball.

It is three years since we played Oldham in League Football, and we were successful at Headingley during that season and then lost at Oldham.


