

Many matches this season have been lost by bad tackling, and two points are of supreme importance-to perfect the means of defence and to develop the quality of anticipation-Every Rugby player should know how to tackle. If we judge by what we see in most matches we should be forced to one of two conclusions—that a third of the players do not know how to tackle or that they have left their knowledge in the dressing room. How often do we see men hesitating, waiting for a pass, pawing at the air, snatching at the shoulders of the man with the ball, when the one thing to do is to go hard and low and bring him down. There is far too much high tackling, far too much dallying. Certainly there are cases in which a defender may be in doubt as to whether to go for the man with the ball or to retain the power to go for the man whom a pass may be given, but in nine cases out of ten the right thing is to ensure that the man in possession goes no farther. As to the character of the tackle, while there are at times, with players bunched together, when it is difficult to go low there can be no question, that when it is possible, to go low is the surest way to stop a man. That is the secret of great tackling. The impetus behind the tackle should be such as not merely to reach the man with the ball, but such as would carry the tackler yards beyond, if there were not "too much solid flesh," to stop him. It is that necessity for the tackler to "go through" his man which makes speed so valuable. The impact given by the real speed when the attacker is taken on the flank will give the tackler an advantage, no matter how big his opponent is. If the defensive player has the speed to get at his man he can time his tackle, and if he goes hard and low there is no escape.
