NOTES

Since defeating Wigan at home, emphatic victories have been gained at Swinton and Oldham, keeping "Town" well in the running for that vital "first-four" position. Last week-end saw us in the third position temporarily after Warrington had slipped from top to fourth with having no game. Our lack of a match yesterday has allowed the leaders to gain a little more ground, and no team can afford a slip-up in any way whatsoever.

With half the season gone, a bare six teams are left to battle out the "top-four" positions, with possibly two more outsiders on the fringe. Could there be any stronger argument for two divisions?

Our game at Oldham last week was a thriller, and in welcoming our last week's opponents to-day, we can probably look forward to the same holiday fare. Oldham played Swinton yesterday, and travelled North immediately after the game. Not quite the same team which played so brilliantly at one period last year, the men from Watersheddings are nevertheless a grand fighting force able to make every team in the league go all the way. Star men in a sound side are Cracknell, £4,000 winger obtained from Huddersfield, international Alan Davies in the centre, Ganley a goal-kicking full-back, with international forwards Goldswain and Winslade.
