

## OLDHAM v. BELLE VUE RANGERS

### WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS

Our team still flatters to deceive and created a big surprise in winning at Wigan on Saturday last, a win that was fully deserved especially as to the way our players stood up in defence when our opponents threw all their weight and resources in the last quarter in an effort to avoid defeat. The Wigan passing machinery could never be got to run smoothly against such splendid tackling that all our players put into the game, and the one try of the match that was scored by us was of the copybook type, good clean handling and strong running followed by a good goal from our full back. Some of the home spectators thought that we were lucky to win, which is quite natural, but they do not give credit to the defensive side of the game, attack must always try to beat defence by varying tactics. Strength in defence is as necessary as strength in attack. We naturally rate more highly the man who does things than the man who prevents them from being done. The aim of the footballer is to score. The desire of the crowd is to see scores. The attacking player—the man who gets tries and kicks goals—is a public hero, on a very different level in popular estimation from the defensive player who prevents scores.

In our game against Whitehaven on Monday evening last our team recorded their highest score of the season—46 points against 6 points. Our visitors had only one change in the forwards that had beaten the Leigh team at Whitehaven on the previous Saturday—and did this with twelve men on the field. We must compliment our team on their fine exhibition although we consider ourselves rather lucky with one or two suspected passes that appeared to be forward, but nevertheless it showed that our team was in fine condition and mood with some splendid running and passing movements.

#### OUR VISITORS

To-day our visitors are Belle Vue Rangers who complete our first team home fixtures for the season and we extend a welcome to them. Like ourselves they have had a very mixed season but have been capable of bringing off one or two surprises during the season. Many great players have been connected with this famous club both as Broughton Rangers and now known as Belle Vue Rangers, but such has been the circumstances of finance that a transfer has been necessary, but still they carry on and we hope for a long time to keep the flag flying in the Manchester district. We hope to see two of our old players in action against us to-day in Dai Rees, scrum-half, and Trevor Williams as out-half (Williams is on loan to Belle Vue).


