



A SEASON OF HOPES AND ILL-FORTUNE

Oldham were not as good a team in 1953-4 as they were in 1951-2, but they went just as close to gaining honours. In the 1951-2 days they were bri'liant in attack, and very jealous in guarding their goal-line and eventually, with a great late season spurt, they were only a point off the top four play-off after whacking Hull Kingston Rovers with the last match of the season.

Mediocrity set in during the following year but "this is OUR season" we were saying in August last year. It might easily have been but for the misfortunte of meeting perhaps the only team which could have knocked Oldham out of the Challenge Cup—Warrington.

I do not blame any one player for losing that a'l-ticket Challenge Cup second round match of tragedy. Why put the burden in one section when the whole team had failed to ram home a distinct first-half territorial advantage? Mistakes made in attack are just as disastrous as those made in defence. The difference is that those made in defence are shown on the scoreboard whereas nothing is done—except groan—to record a miss or some hard luck feature near the opponents' line.

Warrington also finished Oldham's Lancashire Cup hopes. Yet I was one Oldhamer who was proud of my team on that day at Wilderspool on September 24, 1953.

They went down 11-12 but battled like tigers all the way. They could win championships with less fervour than that displayed on the day.

In fact, after that comparatively early-season game, Oldham had hopes of championship, and the Challenge Cup competition was always something to look forward to, whatever the luck of the draw.

I have no cause to want to excuse the team. But I can say that without a shadow of doubt injuries not onlp curtailed Oldham's prowess on the field but sapped morale in the meantime. Oldham were going into battle like infantrymen aware that they had no artillery to help them on the way.

In any case, Goldswain was only recovering from "wounds" and Ganley, Stirrup, Daley, O'Grady, Warham, Wins'ade and others had already been "pipped" by the "enemy."

It was beginning to be apparent that reinforcements were necessary. Steps were taken to remedy the situation. Dick Cracknell was persuaded—and it took a great deal of persuasion—to make Watersheddings his home. He cost Oldham what is to many of us—and to most clubs—a fortune—£4,500.

How much the committee must have debated whether to spend that money; but how much the committee must have debated the necessity of strengthening the team.

The transfer was clinched, so Oldham became £4,500 lighter—but, on paper, formidable in the three-quarter line which, apart from one position, consisted or internationals.

On the left was O'Grady, just now on the verge of making a come-back to form and to glory. His centre was Alan Davies whose fans even now think should have been a tourist. The right centre was causing trouble but now we had another great wingman to pick up the threads and get the best out of his partner.

For some time, Cracknell just didn't work in with the scheme of things. It can never be understood why. All right, he hadn't the partners. But was he himself at his best?

The fact that Cracknell has a best, and a very good best, was shown in tries later in the season. Once he recovered from what seemed a Fartown sickness he was an Oldham thoroughbred, but requiring a centre.

He had four or five, as a matter of fact, but that position has not been settled and is still open to this day.

That is one of the problems for the 1954-5 committee, a bigger problem now that the club has little money to start hunting in the transfer market. However, there are youngsters on the books—Oldham is one the youngest teams in the league—and teambuilding is not out of the question.

Oldham were twelfth club in the table last season. Even with their injuries they should have done better.

Their away form is damaging their reputation. O'dham could thrash Whitehaven twice at home, 45-6 (Lancashire Cup) 46-6 in the league. But they couldn't win at Whitehaven, nor have they won there since Whitehaven joined the league.

Oldham's early season set-backs were defeats at Widnes, where they should have made mincemeat of the home side, and at Bramley, where Daley gained his broken forearm and has languished in an eddie of poor form since. The Stirrup-Daley partnership was broken in the fourth match of the season and it seemed that the dark c'ouds were already gathering over the horizon.

Brilliance at Huddersfield had previously shown what the team could do, even though in this spell-binding match at Fartown Oldham fell behind after being miles ahead. The promise didn't materialise.

Eventually, Oldham won thirteen games, lost twelve and drew three in Lancashire section games. From their 36 Northern R.L. League matches they gleaned seventeen victories, suffered fifteen defeats and drew four games.

Their most damaging period was from October 31 to January 9 when they won only two of twelve games. There was a glimmering of recovery towards the end of the season when four wins were gained in a row, including a staunch 7-2 win at Wigan to gain the double.

Oldham played "middling" football and ended in the middle of the table. They are capable of playing top-class football and can reach the top next season.

It all depends on the firmness and ability and then the response given to the manager-coach called for by members at the annual meeting in May. Whatever the future holds, whatever the future form of the player himself, it must not be forgotten that Bryn Goldswain as coach and captain has given great service to Oldham and has almost, on two occasion, taken the team to championship and Challenge Cup honours for this town of ours.







ITEMS OF INTEREST

Oldham hold a Rugby League record for no other team has p'ayed in four consecutive Challenge Cup finals. Oldham established their record from season 1923-4 to 1927-8.

Oldham also played in five consecutive Northern R.L. finals, from 1906-7 season.

One Challenge Cup final has been played at Oldham, the 1915 meeting between Huddersfield and St. Helens when the Yorkshire side won 37-3 before 8,000 spectators (receipts £470).

Oldham have also staged a Rugby League championship play-off. In this, Swinton beat Featherstone Rovers 3-0 in 1928.

The season previously, Oldham was the venue (in 1927) of the Lancashire County Challenge Cup finals. Swinton also enjoyed a win in that game, beating Wigan 5-2.

Terry O'Grady has a long way to go before beating Jim Sullivan (Wigan) and J. F. Thompson (Leeds) for making most tours to Australia. Both went three times, both in 1924, 1928 and 1932. Sullivan was to have gone a fourth time but withdrew through the illness of his wife.

The only Oldham official to serve as R.L. Council chairman was G. F. Hutchins, who served in that capacity in 1938-9 and the following season.

The record attendance at Watersheddings was 28,000 when Huddersfield were the visitors in 1912. Record receipts established at the Warrington all ticket Challenge Cup second round game in 1953-4 (£2,750) are likely to stand for some time. It was verging on a 20,000 capacity crowd (set by the police for safety) and it can only be beaten by increasing ticket prices. The previous best was the £2,600 gate taken when the Australians were visitors in September, 1952 (£2,600).

Record try-scorer for one season for Oldham was Reg. Farrar, who scored 49 tries in 1921-2.

Record goal-kicker is Bernard Ganley, who landed 145 in



Oldham's International Winger, writes on

My RUGBY LEAGUE CAREER



B. T. O'Grady. A tourist following in the footsteps of Herman Hilton, who, like O'Grady. was Oldhamborn and lived near to the ground.

How life moves! And it takes an invitation to write about it—such as I have received from this great Rugby magazine—to make one fully aware of the speed at which it moves.

I suppose it was pretty certain that I should handle a Rugby ball because the school I attended in Oldham lived for the game. In fact, it was even said that one of the three "R's" at St.—Mary's was for Rugby!

Anyway, that's where it a'l started and I played my first game in the second row. How I evolved into a wingman is rather vague, the most I can say about it is that I appeared in the three-quarter line and after playing there I sensed that, providing I could justify a continuation in this new position, the wing position was the one where I should be happiest.

School, incidentally, was the place where I learned my first important lesson in Rugby — to look after my playing kit! Every Monday morning we had to stand by our boots for inspection purposes and woe betide anyone with last Saturday's dirt on them or with any missing studs! All this fuss seemed to be a bit silly at the time, but I have since learned to respect the motives behind it—you cannot play the game unless you're comfortable. There are other lessons, too, and team spirit was paramount in our training. I remember an incident in class following the usual Saturday game. Apparently one of our forwards had burst through the opposition and instead of passing out to his three-quarters, which he could easily have done, he "dummied" and went on to score himself. I SIGN FOR OLDHAM

On leaving school I joined a continuation league team of the same name, and with all the enthusiasm of the school team. We trained five nights a week and Saturday couldn't come soon enough for any of us. Like every player, my ambition was to play for the senior side in the district, and and you can imagine my delight when I was invited by Oldham to take six trials with them. At that time I was just sixteen, and after three games I was signed on as a professional.

From my very first game with the "A" team I was aware of failings that I had never thought about before, but under the guidance of Alec Givvons I began to improve. My team mates were always ready to help, and players like international hooker Edgar Brooks and local idol Billy Mitchell gave their advice freely.

My debut with the first team was against St. Helens. Due to the weather, the game was abandoned at half time, and I was left thinking: "Blimey. What a way to start!" From then on events moved swiftly and soon I was in the County team against the Kiwis at Warrington. After that match I made a broadcast with my opposite number on the New Zealand team. Bruce Robertson. in the "Under 21 Parade." That broadcast struck up an international Rugby friendship between the two of us that persists yet. I have had the honour of playing for the County twice since then. and have also played for England against Wales.

THANKS TO BILLY MITCHELL

To single out the greatest thrill is a hard task. Probably the greatest moment I can recall was the time when, after months of hard training I saw my name on the first team sheet and knew that my ambition had been realised-I was playing for Oldham, the town where I was born! Rugby spectators set a high standard for their players and they made no exception for me, but with Billy Mitchell alongside me on the field I weathered the initial storm. I cannot let this opportunity pass without paying tribute to Billy for the encouragement and help he gave me personally, and the tireless manner in which he gave of his experience. I shall always have cause to be thankful to him, and never sha'l I forget the way he coached and helped Alan Davies even though he knew that Alan would be the player who would displace him one day. It was in this sort of atmosphere that I spent my early Rugby days-and the same atmosphere exists to-day at Oldham—and I hope I may never have to experience a change.

There are many things I have myself to learn vet, but if I were to give advice to young wingmen of the future I would say, "Never try to ignore your centre. Play as a combination. Spectacular wingers are few and the chances of becoming one are remote. If you can strike up a lasting understanding with your centre, then the spectacle will be there without the individual touch, which, after

all, is "the same difference."

Leigh must feel sorry about missing Davies for eventually they paid £5,000 for another Allan-Trevor Allan-who recently said goodbye to Kirkhall Lane while Oldham's Alan Davies will still be serving at Watersheddings, having cost less than a quarter as much as the fine-tackling Australian.

Davies was an under-21 international. He comes in the category of a born footballer. Perhaps the fact that his father was "Cocky" Davies, one time half-back

with Leigh, has something to do with it. Watersheddings fans were very disappointed he wasn't chosen for the Tour. This 21 year-old player has hardly missed a match since making his debut against Wakefield in September, 1950, averaging 35 appearances a season. He is strong and penetrative and intelligently guards his wingman.
