

#### WHAT IS WRONG WITH THE GAME

Correspondence has been received on our comments in the last issue of the programme upon "What is wrong with the game" and the majority of the replies appear to be the "play the ball" rule being a blot on our game.

Suggestions vary, some state that to get back to the loose scrum after a tackle; pull the the forwards in and you have seven backs against seven, then we should see some of the back movements we saw years ago.

What annoys the supporters with the present "play the ball" rule is the amount of infringements for offside and the defensive barrier that is put up by opponents not in possession of the ball. This minimises open play too.

No matter what idea of the "play the ball" rule is put into operation, players will persist in standing offside and that cannot be the fault of the rule. It is the individual player, by infringements of the rules, that holds up the game and which must be a source of annoyance to the onlooker.

#### TWO DIVISIONS

We understand that the Management Committee of the Northern Rugby Football League are going to put forward a scheme for two divisions. Various schemes have been put forward by individual legislators, but they have fallen on stoney ground by the majority of the clubs in the League. However, we understand that the best of these various schemes can be moulded into a workable and agreeable scheme for all concerned.

Something will have to be done. The game is not dead or dying, and to talk in such strains is definitely detrimental to the game itself. It is up to the clubs to try whatever scheme is put forward—for the sake of the game. The management of each club must be left to the efficiency of such management, some clubs are managed better than others, both from a playing point, and financially. It is up to each club to give value for money, insisting on the playing of the game as it should be played. A levelling up of clubs should be put into operation, not a levelling down as it at present appears.

### COACHING JUNIORS

Each year the R.L. open a Coaching Scheme for players under 21 years of age, at Bisham Abbey, situated near Maidenhead. The scheme is for one week, and commences on June 23rd.

It has been our privilege, with the exception of last year, to have some of our young players accepted. This year we have been allocated four vacancies.

Many of our players in the past have been coached at Bisham Abbey—Davies, Pitchford, Noon, and O'Grady having derived considerable knowledge of the game before arriving in our first team.
