



WHO'S WHO IN THE LEEDS TEAM

J. Dunn, Full back. Age 22 years. Local and a product of the Leeds Club Nursery. Junior International and Yorkshire County Schoolboys Honours.

D. Rose, Winger. A big fine winger with plenty of speed. A Scottish Rugby Union International who signed for Huddersfield prior to his present Club. His father was a pre-war trainer for Oldham.

K. A. McLellan, Centre. An Australian from Rugby Union ranks, signed in 1952.

G. Broughton, Winger. Secured on transfer from Castleford. Son of an old Hunslet winger, and Leeds born.

J. Lendill, Centre. A local boy and product of the Leeds nursery. Yorkshire Schoolboy Honours.

G. T. Brown, Out-half. Another local product and captain of the team, age 24 years. Successful member of the World Cup Team.

J. Stevenson, Scrum-half. Still another local and also from the Leeds Nursery. Has Test Honours. Very fast and elusive.

C. Anderson, Forward. Secured on transfer from Castleford in January, 1955. Yorkshire County Honours.

A. Wood, Hooker. Came to Leeds on transfer from Featherstone Rovers. England and Yorkshire County player.

W. Hopper, Forward. A Welshman transferred from Warrington to Leeds. Came to Oldham for interview prior to joining Warrington.
