

#### WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS

This "play the ball" rule is once again under severe criticism from various clubs and legislators, and it is obvious that from general opinion that the present "play the ball" rule is responsible for many infringements and much foul play.

The Rugby League Council have agreed that clubs engaged in matches this season which do not affect the top four positions in the League table can, if they wish, mutually agree to try alternative methods of playing the ball.

The Rugby Union method, i.e., the tackled player must release the ball, after which it must first be played with the foot.

The tackled player must release the ball (or surrender it to the opposition) if his team is tackled twice in succession without the opponents touching the ball.

The tackled player must play the ball forward

After to-days match we have only one more match to play This is against Workington at home, and I don't think our club will deviate from the rules of the game as laid down for this season.

#### **NEW INSTRUCTIONS**

Arising out of an enquiry into foul play by a Special Committee of the Rugby League, the following are some of the recommendations made by the Council which immediately affects referees and players.

- 1. Referees are reminded that frequent and deliberate cases of obstruction should be considered as grave offences, and offending players should be punished accordingly.
- 2. Foul language by players on the field under any circumstances should be classed as misconduct.
- 3. The Council will take strongest possible action against any club proved in any way responsible for incidents which damage the prestige of the game.
- 4. Any person occupying an official position in the game is responsible to the Council for his actions and will be punished if they do anything to bring the game in disrepute.
- 5. Clubs are reminded that they are responsible for providing adequate protection for players and officials, i.e., Referee and Touch Judges.
- 6. Members of the Council and club officials who make statements to the Press attacking the integrity of other officials in the game or other Committees, shall be deemed by the Council to be guilty of misconduct and shall be dealt with by the Council.
- 7. Coaches shall not be permitted to run up and down the touch line in order to shout instructions to their teams when a game is in progress.
- 8. Clubs should encourage a more sporting attitude amongst spectators by appeals on public address systems or suitable articles in programmes.

Arrangements have now been made to play the postponed Workington match at Watersheddings on Saturday, April 21st, kick-off 3-0 p.m. Although mid-week matches are sometimes unavoidable, we are pleased that Workington have agreed to come on a Saturday. This will give our members and supporters a better chance to attend a Saturday match than a mid-week one.

#### BRIEFS

We are sending four of our up and coming players on a special coaching session from June 23rd for one week to Bisham Abbey, which is in the Thames Valley. The players are: Edwards, McKeown, Ayres, O'Brien, and no doubt they will derive great benefit from the experts that they will be under. The players we have previously sent are Davies, O'Grady, Pitchford, and they have benefitted much from this scheme.

Next season, suggested legislation is being brought forward that both teams must change to alternative coloured jerseys when opposing one another.
