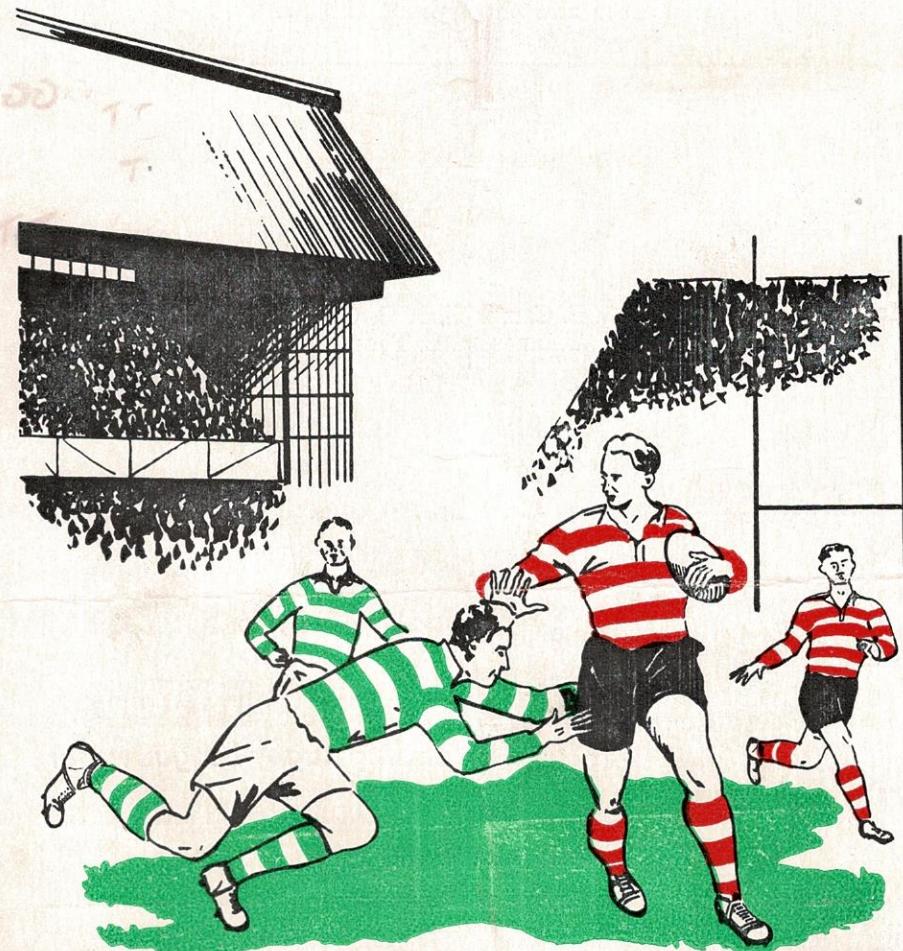

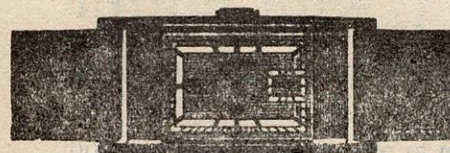

NEW INOVATIONS

Looking back on the seasons new innovations. One is of the two touch judges standing behind the goal posts when a kick at goal is being taken, we consider that this has worked very well during the season generally.

During two of our matches this season we have, however, not been impressed with the decision, and in a match we have seen a hesitant touch judge seeing what his colleague was doing, and if a goal was signalled, he would do the same.

Touch judges who stand behind the goal posts have to be very alert and very alert and very observant. How many times have we seen a kick at goal fall short, and the ball booted down the field towards touch. The touch judge in such a case has to run very hard to the touch line to denote where the ball has entered touch.

However, we consider the innovation worthy of a further trial for next season.

An incident ocured at Odsal Stadium on April 11th during the game between Great Britain and France—only one touch judge went behind the posts to adjudicate on a penalty kick at goal. Was this absent-mindedness or ignorance of the bye-laws?

There is one little matter we should like to see corrected on the field of play, and that is when a player has a torn pair of pants, and he changes them on the field of play in full view of the spectators. It is very embarrassing to a large number of female spectators. The player should be sent to the trainer's bench for replacement, also in the case of a torn jersey this should be the case. We consider that to-day there are more females watching our game than ever before, and a very nice compliment to our game it is, chivalry becomes everybody, and we expect this on our playing fields.
