

If it's been a pretty topsy-turvy season for Oldham one thing can never be disputed — when Oldham strike form they play the most attractive rugby in the league. And in these days when too many games are won by bash and crash methods and the keep possession merchants, it's as good as a tonic to see Oldham run riot.

In a poor man's Gallup Poll round the Press boxes it's generally agreed that the two finest exhibitions of attacking rugby seen this season have both been given by Oldham. And it doesn't require any memory feat to remember the games — against Wigan and St. Helens,

Saints' fans have a good argument when they say their lads were tired after their hefty mid-week programme, but most critics agree that on Saturday, April 14, at Watersheddings, Oldham would have won in any circumstances.

But if Oldham have the ability to thrill the rugby crowds, they can also drive their supporters up the wall on an off-day. Just remember "Black Christmas" and those shock losses to Blackpool Borough and Swinton!

When they are good they are very, very good and when they are bad they are darn near hopeless. It's easy to pick faults with them on these days, but one must always remember that they at least try to play football. There are still plenty of fans who would rather watch a losing Oldham than a team that wins by negative steamroller methods. It is the Oldhams who play the REAL Rugby League game.

And one man who has a lot to do with the Oldham style of play is Frank Stirrup, a man who deserves more honours than he has won. For Stirrup is the ideal clubman — loyal and uncomplaining, and a mighty fine player. It is hard to recall seeing Stirrup have a bad game. You may have seen him when he has made mistakes, but never has he really slipped wholly into the category of a "bad player."

Rugby means more to a player like Stirrup than a big winning bonus; it is still as much a game as a job to him. He enjoys playing. A few more players of Stirrup's calibre and there wouldn't be so many complaints about the poor standard of the game.

Stirrup is aged 30 years. "Why," he asks, "do people think I'm an old man just because I've been playing a long time?"

He joined Oldham from Salford where he is still remembered with affection for his willingness to help the club out in any position in which they chose to play him.

Stirrup's cheerful personality has made him a great favourite at Watersheddings and he is sure to have a bumper benefit when his testimonial falls due.

And it's nice to think that he'll be pleasing the home crowds for a long time to come. As one Oldham committeeman remarked: "If Frank stays at full-back he'll still be playing well at 40."



When last season started, I commenced the business of reporting and commenting on the Oldham Football Club. The current record was good and like all the supporters I anticipated at least equal success this season. Following a poor start it soon became frustratingly obvious that Oldham were not even going to repeat their success of the previous year.

Defeats were followed by transfer requests and a general dis-satisfaction by an abnormally high proportion of the playing staff. What was the trouble?

Then came that fateful Christmas holiday. Defeat at St. Helens followed by a humiliating slap in the face by Swinton Prestige dropped to zero when tiny Blackpool Borough put the final black touches to what everyone supposed would be a merry Christmas.

The top four gone, loyal fans continued to fill the terraces, for even though Oldham were turning in some exasperating results, they were turning out some first class rugby. And there was still the Challenge Cup.

Dewsbury faced Oldham in the first round and the result was never in doubt. Leeds filled the second round and the beforematch comments were "If Oldham can cope with the Yorkshire forwards they will prove the best in the backs".

Oldham more than coped with the burly Leeds forwards, they completely neutralised them. In fact the supremacy was too complete for the Watersheddings six forgot about the speedy seven behind them and tried to make the third round their way.

The result was too many solo efforts, too much mid-field forward battling and too few tries to make the game safe. A draw was in many respects — and particularly because of Oldham's tactics — a fair way to end the game. The last minute "Sunday punch" from Leeds was hard to take, but the Watersheddings team had a host of earlier chances which could have made that final try harmless.

Nothing but the prospects of entertaining rugby remained for the fans. Now for the test. Would they still roll up to watch the team with all the trophies on their way elsewhere?

They did, and what is more the Watersheddings boys made their every journey worthwhile. New combinations were tried and succeeded in those final league games.

The fans and the critics were given plenty to think about for season 1956/57. And what is the promise as the team prepare for another season?

No doubting Oldham's ability to go places. No doubting the committee's ability to spend money filling in gaps. But other important considerations will have to receive more careful attention this time.

Team selection is high on the list. Drastic changes in make-up are out. The chance for experiments is limited and Oldham must quickly find the right combination.

Form can resolve the problem. FRANK PITCHFORD in the mood can be the springboard to success. ALAN DAVIES with support and the right approach can put plenty of punch back in the side.

For most of the back positions there will be plenty of competition, and at long last this is the happy position in the forwards. Two good hookers, several second-row players and a real star blind side prop-forward in DON VINES.

Some positions need prompt attention. At out-half and in the loose-forward position settled faces are a must. They are two vital positions and cannot be subject to neglect or passed into the hands of different players almost every game.

Doubtless these and other minor ailments have and are still receiving attention and on the strength of this, I think Oldham will be back to their more natural selves.

With freedom from injury and sufficient luck, those dreams of last year may be yet achieved. One thing is certain. Whether they are or not, I along with all the fans can be sure of watching the brand of rugby that is truly a credit to the club, the town and the code.







An appreciation

Bryn Goldswain started to play football in his native Merthyr, South Wales, and was an adept at both soccer and rugby. He chose rugby and was a member of the Merthyr Rugby Union team before moving on to Neath, a crack team which regularly has fixtures with Cardiff, Newport and Swansea.

A commissioned officer in the R.A.F., Bryn had ample opportunity to play both kinds of football and in fact had a trial with Wolverhampton Wanderers and performed so well that he had only signed professional forms five days before representatives of the Wolves came along and asked him to sign. Had the Wolves been a week earlier, who knows, Bryn might have been an inside forward with a first division club instead of delighting the Watersheddings fans with his brilliance.

Just before the war Bryn was working in accountancy in London and consequently played little rugby but on entering the R.A.F., he served with Ted Bedford, a Keighley and former Hull Kingston Rovers player, who arranged trials for Bryn with the Rovers. That Bryn was a success with the Robins no one can doubt for he was signed on as a professional in September 1949. Playing as a second row forward in that first season, Bryn scored nine tries for the Rovers, leading the try-scorers, which is a most unusual occupation for a forward. Six months after signing for Hull Kingston Rovers he received his first international cap for Wales against France in March 1946. Thus in his first season in rugby league he made his mark in no uncertain manner.

Accepting a place in a Liverpool Teachers' Training College, Bryn was unable to play as much as he liked as he was placed too far away from Hull to manage every game. A whisper that he would like a transfer reached Oldham and he was signed by the club in July 1949.

That day was a red letter day in the history of the Oldham Football Club and we have not looked back since. His play at loose forward completely revolutionised the Oldham team's play and his distribution of the ball was a joy to behold. Gradually we rose in the table and the team welded into a real combination which took us to the top and but for many injuries at vital times we would have been amongst the honours particularly in season 1954-55 when we lost two finals and finished runners-up in the Lancashire League.

He was a captain who led. Remember that not very long before the advent of Bryn, the easiest way to get on Oldham's transfer list was to accept the captaincy of the team. His leadership was so impressive that he was accorded the captaincy of the Welsh team.

His automatic selection as a member of the Welsh international team and his appearance in the colours of the Other Nationalities and his great service for Hull Kingston Rovers and Oldham all point the fact that he has been a great player and one of our finest exponents of rugby league forward play. His greatest disappointment was when he was passed over for the Australasia tour when he was at the very peak of his career and the Rugby League never made a greater mistake.

Bryn has done great service to his country, for he was grounded when on the way to receiving a decoration after eighty-three operational flights over Germany. He has won a place for himself in the sphere of schoolboy boxing. He is a "man's man."



Here is a challenge and an appeal, a queer mixture you might say, anyhow, it is still, just so, a challenge to those who would like to see the Rugby League game make progress, and an appeal to others who would — without enough consideration — attempt to reconstruct the leagues fixtures.

"Two or Three divisions, which must it be?"

I say leave well alone for a little while yet, until we first of all prove we are getting better attendances to the "A" Team Games (collectively) throughout the league.

Clubs in a "Second Division," and "A" teams as a third would immediately be branded as the inferior sections, whereas, so far, this has not happened, yet all clubs lose money on "A" Team Games. Can the whole league afford to lose money, and for how long; under such a grim test of supporters loyalty.

Expand by all means, but not in the manner suggested by a few hurried thinkers. Let us first of all have a better playing code, a more attractive one, let us first swell our already small grounds attendance capacities to burst points, then we can offer bigger prizes and better ways of sharing them to all the clubs, be they great or small.

In my opinion the game as played now shall receive first attention; it has been stated that patrons will not attend matches unless they are sure of covered accommodation. "How long have we had severe cold and wet weather during three months of the playing season?" — is it a new change of atmosphere? Not likely! This weather trouble has gone on since the Rugby League's initiation, but only the last 10 years have attendances to matches lowered so greatly as to give grave concern to the "Senior Councillors."

"Will covered accommodation improve the spectacle of the game?" By keeping supporters warm and dry, will they be expected to tolerate any kind of display on the field, or would supporters first of all risk a damp atmosphere, and see good, clean, clever, open rugby football, in a league where all are classed as equals regardless of the amount of victories a club must have to be able to survive under the pending dispersal of merit of the "two or three" division league.

Formed at a meeting held at the Prince Albert Hotel, Union Street West, and among the founders were Abraham Fletcher, Charles Hodgkinson (then Chief Constable of Oldham), and Mr. Alfred (later Lord) Emmott. The club was formed in September 1876.

First ground was at the back of the Glodwick Spinning Company's Mill and the players dressed at the Shakespeare Hotel, Glodwick. Later the club shared the ground of the Oldham Cricket Club at Clarksfield.

The first man to gain county honours was A. M. Fletcher, closely followed by J. B. Rye. Other early county players included John Armstrong, a former Clerk of the Peace, C. Barlow and H. Court.

The first game was on Glodwick Lows on October 21st, when Stalybridge beat Oldham by two goals, a poster, one try and one touch down to one try, four touch downs and one dead ball. A "poster" was a shot at goal that went higher than the goal posts and which the scoring side claimed would have been a goal if the posts had been high enough, and which the defending side claimed would have hit the posts had they been high enough.

Oldham's first season saw the team win seven, lose six and draw three of its games, scoring seven goals and eighteen tries and conceding seven goals and eight tries.

Oldham were probably the first Lancashire side to play a game in Yorkshire, meeting Wakefield Trinity on October 6th, 1877

On December 16th, 1876, in the first season the Oldham club left the ground following a disputed decision.

Mr. Fred Wild of Croft Bank Mills and Mr. J. Fletcher were among the early secretaries of the club.

In addition to the first team Oldham had a second team in its first season and by the next season were able to put out a third team for a few matches.

On the 21st November, 1878, a football game was played under electric light in Oldham but was only partially successful.

Oldham's game with Cheetham in 1884 was played on a ground one inch deep in water. When they saw the ground two Cheetham players refused to strip. The only way in which Oldham could persuade the visitors to play was by agreeing that whatever scores were recorded the game would be a draw. A minute before half-time the game was abandoned, Oldham having scored one try and two minors to nil.

The games with Southport Olympic were a cross between rugby and soccer.

Robert Stott was club president in 1885-6. John Saville and Albert Hall shared the secretarial work.

In the game with Mossley in 1893 the two teams played four three quarters probably being the first occasion on which Oldham adopted this system which had been started by Hartlepool Rovers and adopted by Durham County.

Oldham were the champions of the Lancashire Senior Competition in 1893-4 and the following year were runners-up. This was in the rugby union period.

In 1895-6 Oldham were level with Runcorn at the top of the Lancashire Senior Competition of the Northern Union but lost the play-off. That year the club spent a thousand pounds on improving the stands, showing how much more interest there was playing under professional rules.

In 1896-7 Councillor Kempsey was re-elected president and Mr. J. Platt treasurer. Mr. S. Taylor retired after being secretary for fifteen years and Councillor J. C. Buckley, who had been his assistant, was elected secretary.

When Oldham won the Northern Union Cup for the first time in 1898-9, the team won six games in the process, scoring sixteen goals and forty-one tries and conceding four goals and two tries. That year S. Williams scored forty tries for the club.

George Kilner, of Brighouse, was chosen secretary out of over eighty applicants, following the resignation of J. C. Buckley in August, 1899. The salary was £130 per year.

In 1900-1 the first and second teams both won the Lancashire Championship and out of a combined fixture list of sixty-five games, fifty-eight were won

In the three seasons 1898 to 1901, S. Williams scored one hundred and ten tries.

Leading scorers in 1902-3 were Spottiswoode 13 tries, Cash 9 tries, Ferguson 18 goals and S. Lees, jun., 12 goals.

Bert Avery was captain in 1908-9.

Holbrook was top try scorer in 1914-15 with 16. He was the only man to play for Oldham Rugby, Oldham Athletic and Oldham Cricket Clubs,

From 1940-1 to 1944-5 (five seasons) Oldham participated in the Yorkshire Cup.

The first club colours were black and amber jerseys. At one time the club turned out in the club caps.

Bill McCutcheon was the first Welshman to play for Oldham and he gained honours in the Rugby Union and the Northern Union, and at the end of his career as a player he became a top grade referee.

Bernard Ganley has recorded five hundred and fifty goals so far for Oldham.

"Guardsman" Tommy Rees, the only full back who was able to displace Jimmy Sullivan from a representative team, played ten years for Oldham, in which he scored six hundred and sixty eight goals and eight tries. He made one hundred and twenty-one consecutive appearances for Oldham and in all wore the first team colours four hundred times. He gained representative honours under both rugby union and rugby league rules. He made one appearance at Wembley as a touch judge, and has just retired from top rank refereeing.

Some early clubs in Oldham and district were the Oldham Juniors, Oldham Hornets, Oldham Rangers, Royton, Glodwick, and the 31st L.R.V. (Volunteers).

Oldham played the Maoris at Clarksfield on 4th March, 1889, and won easily.

Watersheddings ground first used September 28th, 1889, against Swinton when seven thousand spectators attended. Oldham wearing their new shirts, red and white, lost. The Watersheddings Ground is 776 feet above sea level, one of the highest grounds belonging to any professional club.

A special meeting of the Rugby Union held in Manchester in April 1891 cleared Oldham of the charge of professionalism. A previous meeting of the Lancashire County Rugby Union had also cleared the club saying "that no fault could be found with the club".

Ab Ashworth played for England versus Ireland at Whalley Range on February 6th, 1892.





Oldham Rugby Club had their first training night of the new season this week, but one player who didn't need to loosen-up after the summer lay-off was prop-forward Don Vines. Throughout the summer this 24-year-old Welshman, who came to Oldham last "season, has been keeping fit with snatching and jerking and pressing.

Don, you see, is a keen weight-lifter. Twice a week, sun, rain, hail or snow he takes out the mammoth chest of weights and equipment at his new home in Greenwood Street.

His weights alone total over 550lb., and that does not include the additional equipment that keeps him fit. With the same care as he adds the pounds to his lifts, he collected together the £50 that made his "weight" the pride of Monmouthshire.

With a bench press—his back on a table with his legs hanging over—he got to lifting 275lb. And Vines found that by using different lifts he could gain or lose flesh pounds as he liked.

His progress in the new-found sport was remarkable and he should have entered a competition to find the champion of Monmouthshire. But the Rugby League came on the Welsh scene. The "intruders" were from Oldham and they wanted Don to use his weight for them. Two trials and Vines gathered his wife, child—and weights—and moved North.

"What energy?" the Oldham rugby fans said: "Where does he get it from?" And Don would go home and look at the box of tricks that held the answer.

"Twice a week I get my weights out," he told me in a soft Welsh drawl. "It's the finest way I know to keep fit and keep control of your weight." Don admitted that few rugby players practice the sport, but quickly added that it could be a fine asset to any Rugby League programme.

One word of warning came from Oldham's prize forward. "Weight-lifting can only be done under strict supervision. If any young amateur rugby player likes the sport he can see me—having a go himself can be dangerous."
