GOOD GROUND WORK

On Wednesday the Saints made their way to Hunslet through storms of wind and sleet. Even as we approached the ground our forebodings were not lifted for we were met by a rapid flowing stream from the lower end of the ground.

Fortunately there had been no rain at Hunslet since seven in the morning, and the Club had done a wonderful job of work. The pools of water had been emptied by buckets and then the liberal use of forks and a drying wind had done the rest. A layer of sand on the greasy spots provided us with a ground that was a credit to the Hunslet Club. We could not have done more at Knowsley Road.

Winning the toss, Hunslet took advantage of a strong breeze, but the Saints were quickly on the home team's "25" and that is where they stayed for most of the game. Hunslet evidently were going to make it a forward game, and their cover tackling was extremely effective. Time and time again the Saints were laid by the heels when they seemed sure to be through.

The fine weather had attracted a crowd of 13,300, and they were prepared to applaud the good play of either side. Naturally they were expecting to see something from 'Voll', but the play did not go much his way. On the other wing they quickly rose whenever Howard and Large got the better of their opposing numbers. After two or three passes had been given forward Large was rewarded when he scored a very good try from a difficult pass.

ALEC MURPHY SHOWS UP

The best man on the field must have been young Alec Murphy. He had the whole Hunslet team streaming after him many times, but he did not manage to cross the line, till Hunslet had lost Talbot for a too zealous use of the feet. This was a try that we see too seldom these days. The Saints heeled the ball when on their opponents line. Alec picked up and without ever straightening up, he darted round the pack and over the line as slickly as ever Freddy Trenwith did.
