





CLUB NOTES

TO-DAY'S GAME. As we draw near to the close of the 1957/58 programme we extend a warm welcome to-day to League leaders Oldham. The men from Watersheddings can look back on one of the most outstanding seasons in their history, for in addition to winning the Lancashire Cup, they are strongly favoured for the Lancashire League title and of course they are already assured of a place in the top four play-off for the Rugby League Championship.

Apart from the record of their club this season, several individual members of the side have gained notable achievements. Davies, Turner, Pitchford and Jackson are in the party bound for Australia, and last Saturday, in the home game against Hunslet, full-back Bernard Ganley registered his 205th goal of the season, thus breaking Jim Sullivan's twenty-four year old record. We congratulate Bernard on his remarkable performance. With such an impressive personal record, the decision of the selectors, in omitting him from the tour-side, has proved difficult to understand for Oldham supporters.

Many of the games in the past between Leeds and Oldham have provided some excellent football and this afternoon we look forward to another entertaining match particularly so in view of Oldham's urgent quest for points in their bid for Lancashire League leadership.

TEAM PERFORMANCES. Following close upon victory over Hunslet on Good Friday, the defeat on Easter Saturday was bitterly disappointing, especially after our 30—9 success at Liverpool in February. In gaining their well-earned victory Liverpool became the first Lancashire side to win at Headingley this season. Improved form was shown in the games at Salford and Rochdale, but even so the displays against these teams were not sufficiently effective to take winning points.

A repeat performance today of the type of football Leeds played at Warrington

last month will do much to restore the team's standing.
