HOW TO DO IT!

Writing in Harry Jefferies' Australian Rugby League Year Book, Duncan Thompson, a brilliant half back in his day, says:

"A team of 13 players will beat 13 individuals. How do we get it? Players must be developed mentally. They must be taught to think.

"Rugby League is a game of brains as well as brawn. Any player with the necessary desire and will power can get himself physically fit, but the coach must get him mentally fit. To do this successfully the coach must teach his players:—

- 1.—How to draw the man before passing the ball.
- 2.—How to take the defence one way and the attack the other-
- 3.—The field is only 75 yards wide. Every yard across field eats up yards.
- 4.—Forwards should not run off rucks at an angle (against good defences) except for variety.
- 5.—The half back must not run an inch with the ball if the ball is to be got through to the wing from a set scrum.
- 6.—Possession of the ball is all important, so carry the ball in the hands for quick transfer—not under the arm.
 - 7.—Stay on your feet; dont go to ground with the ball.
- 8.—A try is made by one yard, but may be scored by running 50 or more yards. Find the value of a yard, convert it to time. Thus: a man runs 100 yards in 12 secs.—equals 8 yards in 1 sec.—1 yard in \$\frac{1}{8}\$ of a second.
- 9.—Now, find how many ways in which a player, when he gets the ball, can waste $\frac{1}{8}$ of a second which closes up an opening which may have made a try. Example: Fumbling the ball before passing, or by movement to the left of the body, if the ball is passed to the right.

Another example: A pass thrown at the hip loses time while the catcher turns to catch it, then turns to the front again.

N.B.—The ball should always be passed in front of the body.

Another example: Half back picks up the ball then stands up before passing it.

10.—Forwards fight to get possession only to find (on breaking up) a back has been caught in possession—why? All the $\frac{1}{8}$ of seconds lost has enabled the defensive backs to get on top of the attack—This is the cancer of Rugby.

11.—The answer is: The lecture on variety. If the attacking team's centres are to make tries (which is their job) they must have room in which to move when they get the ball from the two half backs. To do this, the opposing or defending centres must be in doubt whether to move up or out. This doubt is created by the variety of play of the half backs.

12. Speed, Speed, Speed. Must have speed of action in :-

(a) Hooking the ball.

(b) Passing from base of scrum or ruck.

(c) Running with the ball (Don't dawdle). Run. If you are slow, give the ball to a fast ball carrier.

13. Back play may be summed up thus:—
There are two halves, two centres, two wings.

The halves create the necessary variety, to give the centres room to move, for the wingers to score the tries.


