

#### CLUB NOTES

TODAY'S GAME. Our fixture this afternoon is one of the most attractive games in our League programme this season and it is with very great pleasure that we welcome all our friends from the Watersheddings today.

In recent years Oldham have been a consistently strong side and the Club, and several individual members of the team, have featured in various R.L. Honours Lists. Four Oldham players were in the party which toured Australasia, and last April full-back Bernard Ganley achieved well-deserved acclaim in breaking Jim Sullivan's twenty-four year old goal-kicking record.

This season Oldham defeated St. Helens, by 12 points to 2, to win the Lancashire County Cup and in gaining this outstanding victory, they secured the Lancashire Cup for the third successive year. Today, therefore, we have the interesting aspect of a match involving this season's respective County Cup holders, and if the game is as thrilling as our last meeting, at Oldham in November, when we were beaten by 13 points to 12, then we may look forward to a first class display of football.

Leeds have already accounted for Wigan and St. Helens at Headingley this term, and today our team will be endeavouring to complete a home "hat-trick" over the three most powerful Lancashire clubs, though Oldham will be equally determined to prevent this, and thereby gain a "double" at our expense.

RECENT MATCHES. This wintry weather has played havoc with our fixture list this month and as a result it is now four weeks since our last first team match at home. However, the turn of the year certainly brought a dramatic change in our



fortunes and in the game against St. Helens, our team rose to the occasion magnificently to register the first defeat over the mighty Saints in twenty-one consecutive League games.

Last Saturday at Leigh, Leeds maintained the encouraging form shown earlier and after a closely-fought game we gained our fifth win in Lancashire this season. Leigh produced a much higher standard of football than their League position suggested and after a try by Mick Martyn, their most outstanding forward, they fought strongly to erase our two-point lead, but Garry Hemingway's superb last minute try completed a good win. It was largely a team victory and the side as a whole displayed great confidence. Well done, boys! Keep it up!

WELCOME to Derek Hallas who has joined us from Keighley and made his debut for Leeds last Saturday at Leigh. We take this opportunity of wishing Derek a happy and successful career in the Leeds colours.


Army, Pat played at centre and on the wing for Aldershot Services, Hampshire and for the Army against Eastern Counties.

After leaving the Forces in 1950 he joined New Brighton R.U.F.C. and in September of that year he played his first game for Lancashire against Yorkshire. This match incidentally took place at the Headingley R.U. Club's ground at Kirkstall. In 1950 also, at the age of twenty, Pat played in three English Trial matches, but he was not to gain his first cap until three years later.

In 1951 he was a member of the Barbarians Easter Tour XV and two years later he was selected to play in his first International. This was in the England v. Wales match at Twickenham in 1953 and Pat played at centre on that occasion. Four more international appearances followed and in 1955 he toured South Africa with the British Lions, when he played in the centre, wing, off-half and full-back positions.

On return from the tour Pat rejoined New Brighton and on 21st August, 1956, he signed for Leeds, for whom he made his debut, at Headingley, against Featherstone Rovers. He played throughout the 1956/57 season including the Cup Final at Wembley in 1957 which Pat describes as the most memorable game in his career.

This season, despite occasional recurrence of a troublesome shoulder injury Pat has again displayed many of the qualities which took him to the top-most flight of the Union game and has placed him among the outstanding full-backs of the Rugby League today.


