### SAINTS GOOD SEASON

The season 1958-9 is now ending and we as spectators can look back with pleasure and recall some of the wonderful games that we have seen. It has been a season with very few dull moments. If the games proved somewhat one-sided, Tom van Vollenhoven or Alec Murphy were always there to give that touch that brought the spectators on to their toes.

But it has been the work of the team that has brought the success that has been achieved this year. Not only have the Saints been sitting at the top safely for the last few matches, while Wigan, Oldham, Hunslet, Swinton and Wakefield have been struggling among themselves, but they have finished a clear five points above Wigan who are second. In doing this they have become the first team in the Rugby League to score 1,000 points in the season.

This record of 1,005 points is a feat that the whole team can be proud of. The previous record number of 996 points was scored by the great Huddersfield in 1911-12. To be classed with them in the annals of the game is indeed a distinction.

By their victory over the Saints on Monday night, Oldham won their way into the fourth position. Indeed it was necessary to go into decimals to determine whether Hunslet or Oldham played Wigan or St. Helens, so close were their aggregate points for and against. Last year Oldham were in first position with 67 points against the Saints 64. Facts like these show that consistently good results go to the teams who are go ahead in their outlook. At a number of other places besides St. Helens and Oldham, where wisdom has been shown in the management of their business, some teams have come to the fore this season. There is no need to mention Wigan here for they are always trying, but we have Hunslet and Wakefield, Widnes and Swinton who have ousted some of their more successful neighbours of former years. Visiting the grounds of these and other teams one is immediately struck by the value that the "lotteries" have been to our game. Wakefield, Widnes, and Hunslet have really given a new look to their grounds.

To turn again to our visitors while they do not look so imposing on the field as they did last year, but, helped by Ganley's (189) wonderful kicking, they have attained their objective, even when they have been behind in try scoring. Still their team work
