

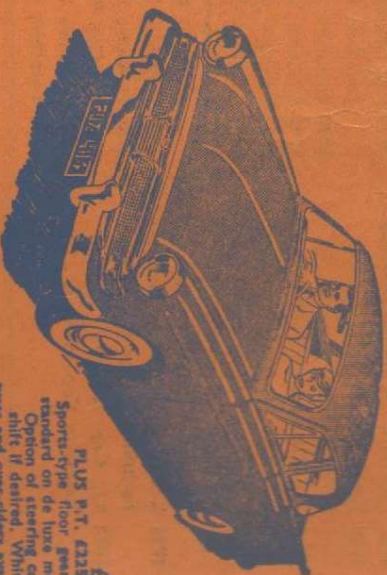

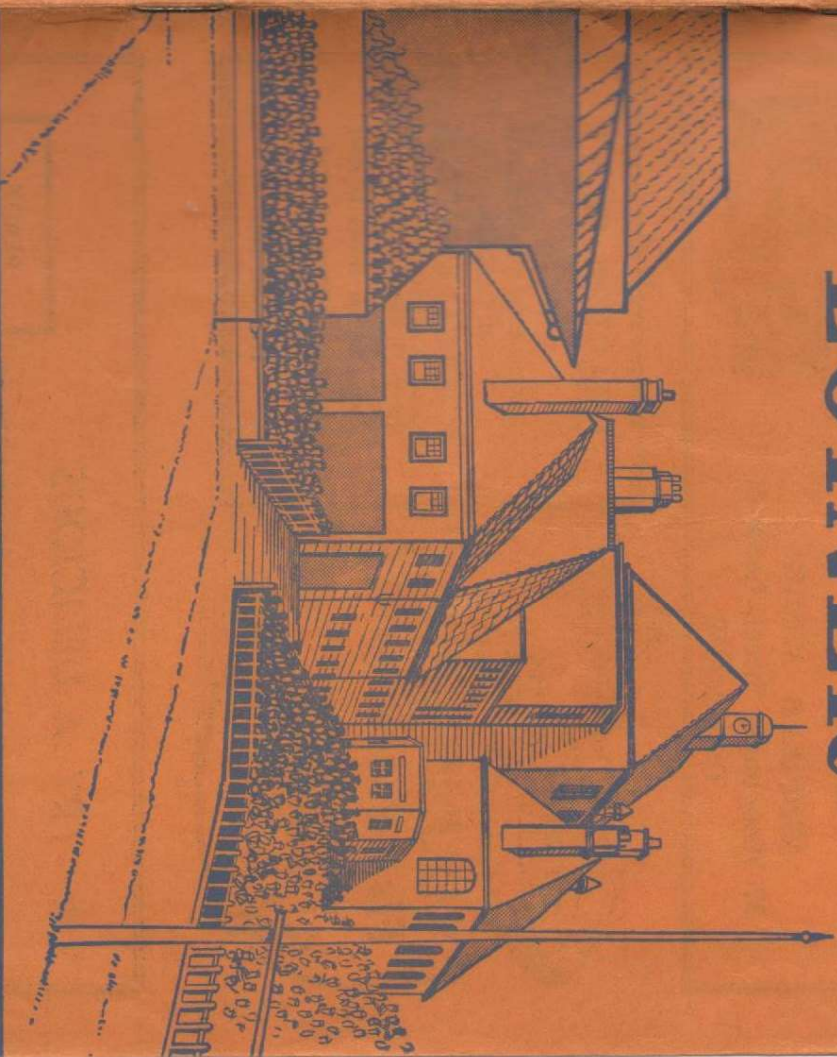

## CLUB NOTES

**OUR VISITORS.** The last time the Oldham team came to Headingley was just over a year ago and the side arrived during a period of revival in our fortunes. Two weeks before our meeting, we had defeated St. Helens here and a week later we went to Leigh to hand out a thrashing to the Hilton Park team. When we met Oldham the revival continued and a thrilling match ended in a victory by 18 points to 15, for Leeds. In the match here two seasons ago, our visitors ran out winners by 26 points to 11, but once again we saw some good football. Our matches against Oldham have gained a tradition for producing first class entertainment and in welcoming our visitors to Leeds today, we look forward to yet another exciting game.

The Lancashiremen will be without one of their Internationals today, for star wingman Ike Southward is in the Great Britain Team to play France tomorrow. Ike, who has been among the games highest scorers in recent seasons, at present leads the way in the side's try-scoring list this season, with a total of 27 tries. Strong-running centre Johnny Noon is next with 21 tries and he is followed by Oldham's Yorkshire County stand-off Alan Kelleit who has scored 20. Leading goal-kicker of course is full-back Bernard Ganley, who is also at the head of the Rugby League scoring table. In this season's football, Ganley has registered no less than 168 successful goal-kicks.

Outstanding members of the Oldham pack at the present time are Roger Duffly and second-row man Geoff Robinson, who joined Oldham from Whitehaven at a fee of £9,000, and made his debut in the Oldham colours on the occasion of our visit to the Watersheddings last August. Loose forward Haynes, recently signed from Swinton, has fitted in well with his new colleagues, and the all-round strength of the current Oldham line-up has aroused great enthusiasm among their followers, who firmly believe their side is heading for Wembley this season.

These have been some of the typical comments we have read or heard during a week which has scarcely ceased to hum with opinions on the thriller at Central Park last week, as every aspect of a memorable battle has been related and discussed over and over again. It would be unfair to single out individuals for special praise, for every member of our team gave his best, and each shared with our followers the feeling of bitter disappointment, as victory was snatched from our grasp in the dying moments of the game.

Though the match was not quite a "classic" from a purely football viewpoint, the tactical battle and close score maintained tremendous interest and excitement throughout and it can be fairly stated that if Wigan win through at Wembley they can never have a tougher cup-tie struggle and emerge victorious.

# **PEN PICTURE — COLIN EVANS**

Colin Evans was born at Blaenavon, South Wales, on 18th November, 1936, and he attended Park Street School, in his native village, where his early football soon earned him a place in his School XV at serum-half. He soon developed a strong preference for the No. 7 spot and this position, incidentally, is the only one he has ever played during his career. His displays in Schools' Rugby led to his nomination as reserve to the Welsh Schoolboys' Team in 1950, and shortly after leaving school he joined the Fortside R.U. Club, which is in effect the reserve side to the Blaenavon First Team. After one season he moved up into the First XV, at the age of seventeen, and he was a member of the Blaenavon Team which won the Monmouthshire League Championship in 1954.

The following season Colin joined the Newport Club, with whom he was to spend three successful seasons in top-flight Welsh Rugby. In 1955/56 and 1956/57 Newport won the Welsh Championship Title in addition to winning the Welsh Seven-a-side Competitions, played at Swansea, in both these seasons. It was within a few months of joining Newport that Colin's outstanding performances attracted the attention of the Welsh selectors and in 1956 he was chosen as reserve to the Welsh Team which met Ireland and France. In 1957 Colin was awarded the Arthur Bowsher Cup, a highly-regarded honour in Welsh R.U. circles, which is presented to the most promising player of the year.

Though he was still with Newport in 1957/58, he had three games with Pontypool as a "permit" player, and at the beginning of the following season, he accepted an invitation to join the Pontypool Club. Colin appears to have a habit of bringing success to the Clubs he joins, for once again, at the end of his first season with Pontypool, he was a member of the team which won the Welsh Championship, in addition to finishing as runners-up to Newport in the Seven-a-side Competition.

His greatest honour in Rugby Union was achieved when he was selected for his native Country in the Wales v. England match at Twickenham this year, and shortly afterwards of course he signed for Leeds, to add yet another name to our list of Internationals.

Already, Colin, a likeable and loyal player has shown many of the fine qualities which led to his successes in Wales, and we trust that he and Mrs. Evans will thoroughly enjoy their stay in Leeds.
