SCRAPBOOK FOR SEASON 1928-29.

The annual report of the Swinton club shows a profit of £939. 19s. 8d. on last season, as against £1,363. 5s. 11d., the previous year.

Gate receipts amounted to £11,505. 7s. 1d., less £1,900. 2s. 2d. paid to other clubs. Season tickets brought in £1,761. 17s. 6d., an increase of £40. 4s. 6d. on last year.

The largest item in the expenditure was £6,270. 6s. 9d. for wages, bonuses, transfer fees etc., as against £6,296. 17s. in season 1926-27 whilst £1,329. 7s. 5d. was paid in Entertainments Tax.

Included in the assets is the sum of £2,086. 9s. paid by the club for their new ground at Pendlebury Road, Swinton.

Messrs. E. W. Worsley, J. C. Robertson and H. Edwards are the retiring directors and offer themselves for re-election.

Robert Scott, the Cumberland Rugby League full back, lately associated with Carlisle City and Huddersfield, has joined Swinton and he will play his first game for the league champions against Hunslet at Chorley Road tomorrow.

Scott, along with all the other players of the late Carlisle City club, was declared a free agent by the Rugby League Management Committee a week ago.

He is 5ft. 6in. in height and 10st. 10 lb. in weight, has twice played for Cumberland this season and was a members of the county championship side last year.

Fast and a safe fielder, Scott has had a wide experience for he has played for Warrington, Batley and Huddersfield since leaving Aspatria Hornets.

The directors of the Swinton club are prepared to receive offers for the following players who have been placed on the transfer list at their own request: S. B. Phillips (wing threequarter), H. Blewer (hooker forward), J. Fairhurst (hooker forward), T. J. King (forward), J. Butters (loose forward).

The best known of these are Blewer, who appeared regularly last season, and Fairhurst. Butters is a brother of the county loose forward.

They have now fixed the fees in respect of four of them as follows: Blewer £200, Phillips, Fairhurst and King £50 each.

J. Wright, a Rugby Union forward who has played with Carlisle is being introduced as striker in place of Fairhurst. Wright, who is 20 years of age, is 5 ft. 10 in. and weighs 13 stones.
