Oldham F.C. Secretary's Report

Playing Record

The playing record for season 1959/60 does not compare favourably with the previous season as evidence by our final position on the Rugby League table being No. 9 as against No. 4 the previous season. It is obvious that our standard of play has not been up to the consistency of previous seasons, even allowing for our team to be at full strength. Our forward strength is not up to the required standard and replacements have been hard to find for such star forwards as Derek Turner and Don Vines (both transferred to Wakefield) and the retirement from the game of Sid Little. We have several good young forwards coming along in the "A" team but they lack experience and time alone will tell if they make the top grade.

The season commenced with a rousing win over Rochdale Hornets in the Charity match and we were optimistic that our playing season would come up to the standard we require. We lost four League matches at home against Warrington, Wakefield, Wigan and St. Helens which put a serious set back to our championship honours. A Club cannot afford to lose its home matches and should win the majority of its away matches. Some good away victories were recorded at Halifax, Barrow, Rochdale, Widnes and Hunslet, and some of our losses were unexpected. After our unexpected defeat in the semi-final of the Challenge Cup a spate of injuries hit the Club, the number of 19 players being injured creating a record. This obviously affected the playing strength, for, of the last six matches played, we lost five which made our position in the League one of decline.

match was played on Saturday, 29th August, 1959. We fully expected a hard match as we realise that the Whitehaven Club are always a difficult Club to beat on their own ground, but we did not expect to lose the match by the large score of 23 points to 5 points and we were well and truly beaten on the day, by a better team. Early in the game we had hopes when we scored a brilliant try, which was converted, but afterwards our team appeared to lose their grip on the game and we lost the match and the Cup.

Our share of the net receipts were £240 15s. 4d., which compares very unfavourably with £4,375 11s. 5d. received the previous season in all rounds and winning the Cup. This defeat was a serious set back to the income of the Club and we realised that some great effort would have to be made to re-coup this big deficiency of income, by League and Challenge Cup income.

Challenge Cup

One of the greatest disappointments of the season was our inability to get to Wembley for the Challenge Cup Final. Never has a greater opportunity presented itself for this to be our Wembley Year, it appeared to be put on a plate for us. We had the luck of the draw in the three rounds in being drawn at home against Huddersfield, Walney Central and Bramley, and reached the semi-final against Hull at Swinton on April 9th. Everyone was confident as to the result of the match, possibly over confident, and on the day our team never functioned as a team and we were surprisingly beaten by 12 points to 9 points. Our team tried hard enough but it was evident that this was not our day and we let slip that glorious adventure of a Royal Wembley. The disappointment must linger with our members and supporters after the luck of the draw had favoured us.

What is the £ s. d. value of Supporters Clubs?

by TOM LONGWORTH (News Chronicle-Dispatch)

I once made an attempt to discover how much revenue Rugby League Clubs derived from Football Pools and, not too politely, was told to mind my own business.

Obviously the amount was too staggering to reveal. It might have shown the general finances of the Clubs up in a very poor light.

We all know that the aggregate total must be colossal and we have to admit that the revenue derived from this source has dispelled poverty from the doors of many Clubs; but let us rid our minds of a belief that pools are the only money-raising factors to which Club supporters have devoted their efforts.

I am awaiting the day when the National Federation of Rugby League Supporters' Clubs will compile and publish a complete statement detailing how much each individual parent Club has received from them in money, or other form of gifts, since the war and for them to arrive at a grand total. If such an actuarial task can be accomplished the figures would be so sensational as to be scarcely believable.

There is a wonderful spirit of loyalty and honest intention to serve the game in every community. No Club has ever failed to find a ready response for volunteers to do specified tasks, or shoulder the wheel in a crisis; but there are Clubs, confident in their affluence who have given the cold shoulder to their Supporters' Clubs — refused their facilities, which is to be regretted.

There have, of course, been instances when Supporters' Clubs, because of the substantial support they have given, have attempted to assume some power and become dictatorial in the conduct of the parent Club. This naturally caused friction.

This should never be. Whatever may be the extent of the assistance given by the Supporters' Clubs it should not be used as an instrument to attain power. When such is attempted a Supporters' Club kills its primary object. At the same time, I feel that Club officials could be more appreciative, bring supporters' representatives more into their deliberations and become more interested in the social side of things.

We are very pleased that the Committee of the Oldham Supporters' Club still feel that a little effort from me on behalf of the Amateurs is of keen interest to the Supporters' Club Year Book which is looked forward to each year by the members of the Club. We are very grateful to the Committee of our hard working Supporters' Club for this honour.

During the past year the Amateurs have received yet another set back in their efforts of self administration by the setting up of a Commission by the Rugby League Council and the abandoning of the County Committees of the Amateurs. Who sits on this new Commission we do not know, and who has selected the persons on the Commission we know not. So is it any wonder that the worker in the Amateur side of the game are concerned by the actions of the Rugby League Council on this matter.

We in Oldham will still carry on with the workings of the League for the Amateurs because without these young boys we could have no senior teams to watch on a Saturday afternoon. The Oldham area is one of the strongest in the Amateur side of the game; in the open age section we have 15 Clubs in membership, an increase of two on last season. The new Clubs are Rome Mill and Bradford Colliery which will be under the coaching of Norman Harris the former Oldham player. We are not as strong in the Intermediate League having only four Clubs in membership. In the Continuation League we have also two new Clubs this season in St. Patrick's and the Technical College which is being coached by John Marre, also a former Oldham player.

The financial position of the Leagues are not too sound and an appeal has been sent out to all Rugby League Supporters in the Oldham district to become Vice-Presidents of the League, and we hope that this appeal will receive a good response from the Supporters that attend the games at Watersheddings.

Once again my sincere thanks to the Committee for the privilege of this small contribution to the Year Book.

The Werneth Club, which is a member of the Oldham Continuation Rugby Football League, was formed by enthusiasts from a well known grammar school. These lads had numerous practice matches and played friendly games with boys from the other two grammar schools of the town. It was then decided in the summer of 1959 to enter the Continuation League under the name of Werneth R.F.C.

Training sessions were held throughout that summer and by the beginning of the season the lads were quite fit and very enthusiastic. The one thing lacking was experience as practically all the boys were converts from soccer.

Once the season got under way, unforseen difficulties arose the lack of a suitable trainer to teach the team the "know how," the studies of the boys hampered extra training sessions and the school soccer team claimed some of the boys. Injuries caused by the hard ground (after that glorious summer) and the fact that the high winds had swept away the top soil from the ground, plus the work of vandals who repeatedly pulled down, broke or stole the goal posts, all had a disastrous effect. The ground is the Parish Church Junior School ground and we thank them for allowing us to use it, as otherwise we would have no ground to play on.

Financially the Club is quite sound. Players pay a weekly subscription and of course there is a grant from the Continuation League, which comes from the takings at the Law Cup match between Oldham and Rochdale Hornets. The Rugby Football League itself provides under seventeen teams with jerseys and stockings, and the only equipment bought by the Club comprises ball, first aid kit, bucket and the "magic" sponge.

The Oldham Continuation Rugby League this season is at its strongest for some years and there should be seven clubs in membership. That means that over a hundred youths in the under seventeen group will be playing rugby league this season.

The decision to form our Club was a correct one, and during 1960/61 some successes should come our way. We shall enjoy our rugby football in any case.

Oldham . . . A Club of Shocks

Over recent years Oldham has become quite a Club for hitting the headlines. Turning on the rugby genius they have wrung every superlative from every writer who ever had the signal honour of watching them play.

Make no mistake, it has been a satisfying honour to try and turn Oldham's footballing deeds into print . . . and it has been an awesome experience following their administrative trials and tribulations.

Behind the scenes, last season was unprecedented for incident. Throughout the nine month long spell of rugby at Watersheddings hardly a day passed without Oldham making the big news.

The season started without crack forwards Derek Turner and Sid Little. Dick Cracknell was in dispute of the Club and stalwart Frank Daley had hung up his boots for the last time.

On the credit side top priced winger Ike Southward was settling in and hopes were high that the £9,000 fee for forward Geoff Robinson — a world record price — would be justified.

But the big news in the comings and goings department was to be overshadowed by an even bigger event that startled the sporting world and shook the old Watersheddings Club to its very foundations.

It started with the shock resignation — for the second time — of official Jack Lewthwaite because of "payments and promises made to players."

Close behind him was the then Rugby League Chairman and popular Oldham official Frank Ridgway. After that the drama burst on to the public. Ten Oldham officials were expelled from the game by the Rugby League.

There was more. One player was suspended until he repaid a loan to the Club and several others were deadlined to bring their own repayments to the Club up to date.

A court action followed and the caretaker committee of two were re-joined by their old colleagues — reinstated and cleared of breaking the rules of the game.

This kind of carry-on would justify the slump of any Club's fortunes — but Oldham had even more reason for that very lean 1959/60 season. They had injuries to contend with.

And those breaks, bumps and bruises never seemed to come to an end. No sooner would one star return to the field than another would go — and that situation went on from one end of the season to the other.

Amid everything that happened at the Club last season there can be found then a valid reason for that cheerless slump in rugby prowess. But really . . . was it so bad?

Oldham finished ninth in the Northern League — much lower than in recent years but still well on the right side of the halfway mark. They scored 156 tries against 159 the previous season and 201 goals against 208.

They had some magnificent victories — as well as some shocking defeats. Defeats like the Challenge Cup final when every man, woman and child in the town said it would be Wembley year.

In that troubled season new names appeared — names and performances that warmed the chilly hearts of disillusioned supporters. These young players proved that Watersheddings still had a future.

Forwards John Warburton, Alf Mumberson, Peter Goddard, David Goddard, Tommy Parker and Terry Ogden, and backs Bill Patterson and Brian Lord were just some of the "understudies" in the rugby drama.

Now Oldham are into the new season. I regret the absence of some ready-made material, but I am delighted to see the high enthusiasm among the playing staff.

It coincides — not by accident I am sure — with the arrival at the Club of the first full-time Manager-Coach, Gus Risman, a name that needs no introduction.

Risman is a strong man of Rugby League. He has a wealth of experience, gained not only as a top rate player, but as a keen student of the game on and off the field. He is already having a great effect at Watersheddings.

Not only is enthusiasm high, but the standard of fitness is high. Scouting is being intensified and a keener eye is being cast towards the young amateurs of the town. Oldham in fact is buzzing with anticipation.

I can only hope it pays off dividends quickly for the town has become too accustomed to top class rugby victories. If the crowds are to be maintained at 'Sheddings that standard must be re-discovered.

If it isn't quite found this season, the opening phase has convinced me of one thing. It will not have been for lack of trying.

Phil Thomas was transferred to Leeds in 1904/5 for the then record fee of £250.

From 8th September, 1906, to 16th March, 1909, the Oldham team was not defeated at Watersheddings, winning 60 consecutive home matches.

In 1907/8 Oldham lost only two games in the league and drew two others.

Miller scored seven tries for Oldham v. Barry on October 31st, 1908.

Evan Davies signed for Oldham on December 11th, 1911, and played regularly until 1926.

Rod Marlor made his debut for Oldham in season 1913/4.

In 1916/7 Oldham played 24 games and included 66 players in the various games. Ten members of the Anzacs (Australian and New Zealand Auxiliary Corps) played for the team. All ten were New Zealanders.

Tommy Cash gained the Military Medal, Arthur Smith also gained the M.M., and F. W. Wise was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal during the first world war. All were players on the Oldham books. These were mentioned in the annual report for 1917/8 in which season the Oldham team did not function. W. Biggs and J. Swithenbank were also awarded the M.M.

In 1917/8 the Club had 48 players, the secretary and a committeeman in the armed forces.

Maurice Tighe signed for Oldham at the beginning of the 1919/20 season.

Reggie Farrar signed on October 7th, 1920. He set up the tryscoring record for the Club the following season with a total of 49. He also kicked 34 goals.

Joe Ferguson played his last first team match v. St. Helens on April 14th, 1923. He captained Oldham, Cumberland and England against the All Blacks in 1907/8 and the three teams all won.

In 1923/4 Joe Corsi scored 30 tries and Albert Brough scored 25 tries and 64 goals.

Billy Hall played his last game for the Club v. Featherstone Rovers on March 14th, 1925, and Harold Wagstaff made his last appearance against Oldham on March 23rd, 1925.

Freddy Ashworth became a regular member of the first team in 1926/7 and until his retirement in 1938/9 he played in 439 games, scored 38 goals and 39 tries.

Tommy Rees, from 1928/9 to 1938/9 inclusive, played in 400 games for the Club and scored 7 tries and 668 goals. Later he

guested for the Club during the war and played in another 27 games and scored 23 tries. He was the only man to displace Jim Sullivan from the Great Britain side.

Apart from season 1917/8 the Oldham Club has played every season since 1876/7.

Ben Benyon, the former Oldham half-back, played for Wales under Rugby Union rules.

Tom McCabe played for Wigan and Widnes before joining Oldham. Afterwards he joined Dewsbury.

The crowds broke in the ground at Watersheddings on the following dates: 24th February, 1912; 25th December, 1896; 25th September, 1909; 12th January, 1901.

Harry Varley was a player and a member of the committee at the same time, as was Anlezark, the Australian, some years later.

Watersheddings ground is 776 feet above sea level.

The Club's first game with Stalybridge on 21st October, 1876, was lost by 2 goals and a poster (i.e. a shot higher than the goalposts which the scoring side claimed would have been a goal if the posts had been higher) one try and one touchdown to one try, four touchdowns and one dead ball.

Oldham had a third team in 1877/8.

A. M. Fletcher was selected for the Improbables v. the Probables in the Lancashire County Trial of 1877/8.

Football was played under electric light in Oldham on 21st November, 1878, but was only partially successful.

Joseph Platt, first secretary of the Northern Union, joined Oldham on October 16th, 1880. Later he became the Club Treasurer.

The Club paid £5 19s. 0d. for beer and lemons in season 1886/7.

The Oldham team to play the Maoris in 1888/9 included Jack Hurst of Leigh, H. Jowett of Failsworth, J. Nolan of Rochdale Hornets, W. H. Pennington of the same Club, and T. Whittaker of Manchester. Oldham won by three tires and one goal to nil. Oldham also scored five minor points and the Maoris ten minors.

Watersheddings ground was first used by the Club on September 28th, 1889.

Early Welsh internationals included Bill McCutcheon and Dai Gwynne.

Ab Ashworth played for England v. Ireland at Whalley Range in 1892.

Oldham scored 112 tries in 1893/4, and of these Jack Hurst claimed 43.

Oldham were the champions of the Lancashire Senior Competition of the Rugby Union in 1893/4.

The Rugby Union suspended Wigan, Salford and Leigh for professionalism in 1894/5, and this caused the start of the Northern Union in the following season.




