The Rugby League season has always been looked upon as a two-part programme, the first half being played in the old year, and the second half in the new. Today with the visit of Oldham we welcome both the New Year and the visitors, with an especial welcome to the ground to the maestro himself, who now manages the play-side of affairs at Watersheddings, Gus Risman. It will be remembered by most if not by all, that Gus ended his playing days with Workington, he was the club's first choice for the fullback position until his retirement, and sad to relate, we have had nothing even approaching his class in the position since the day that he hung up his boots.
