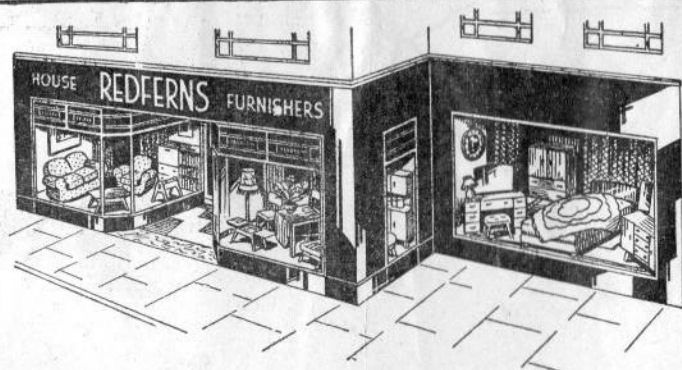



FLASHBACK TO 1928-29.

Prior to the start of the 1928/29 season the following appeared in the *Athletic News*:—

"The administration of the Salford club has undergone a vast change. The board of directors has been reconstructed and, following the resignation of Mr. F. B. Horner, who for eight years rendered yeoman service in the capacity of honorary secretary, Mr. L. B. Todd the former All-Black and Wigan player has been appointed secretary/manager.

"Debenture holders have agreed to forego their claims and the club is now in a better financial condition than for many years.

"The new board is prepared to provide the necessary wherewithal to build up a strong team, but, to use the words of the chairman, Mr. C. B. Riley, we prefer to wait until we can get the best men for the weak positions rather than be rash and perhaps get no better player than we have already.

"Hudson, the three-quarter who joined the club towards the end of last season and gave such promising displays, has returned, as also has Davies, the Welsh wing three-quarter; but the season may possibly open without Gore, the Welsh international loose forward, and Meek, the Welsh half-back, who have both been placed on the transfer list.
