Peter Norburn Testimonial Fund.

This afternoon a collection will be taken on behalf of Peter Norburn's Testimonial Fund.

Peter joined us from Worsley Boys' Club, Wigan, in May 1950, and soon gained prominence as a stong wing three quarter. In 1954 he was selected to play for England against Other Nationalities

and scored four tries. During the past few years he has played in the second row of the forwards and in this position gained Test selection but was unfit to play. One of the personalities of the game, Peter is one of the most popular players to play for Swinton.

SCRAPBOOK FOR 1926-27

Swinton have made an important addition to their ranks by obtaining the transfer from Huddersfield of R. H. Cracknell, a second row forward, or loose forward, who has scored 10 tries for the Fartown club this season.

Cracknell was formerly a wing threequarter with Leeds and when with Huddersfield he also played occasionally in the back division.

Cracknell, who has played for Yorkshire in County Championship matches, is a native of Leeds, stands 6 ft. in height and weighs 12 stone 5 lbs.

The transfer fee was originally fixed at £200, but this figure has been slightly reduced.

Despite their high position and splendid record, Swinton are sparing no effort to maintain their playing strength. Secretary Mr. Sam Jones, who by the way is now a full time official, has secured the signature of a new forward, Martin Hodgson, of Egrement, who is only 18 years old, stands 6 ft. in height and scales 13 stone 9 lbs.

Hodgson has gained County honours for Cumberland this season being one of the most conspicuous forwards in the recent match against Yorkshire.

Several other Rugby League Clubs were interested in Hodgson, who should prove a valuable acquisition for Swinton.

The Swinton balance sheet is the most successful in the club's history. It shows a profit of £1,372 on the past season during which the club won the Rugby League Challenge Cup, the Lancashire Challenge Cup and reached the semi-final of the League Championship. Gate receipts totalled £11,751, less £1902 paid to other clubs.
